*Intended Exhibition of Light on Royal Sovereign Shoals.*

The light will be a revolving white light, showing three flashes in quick succession every minute; the time occupied by the exhibition of these flashes will be about twenty-three seconds, and the interval of obscurity between each successive three flashes will be about thirty-seven seconds.

The light-vessel will be distinguished in the day-time by a small ball over the usual mast-head ball, and by having "Royal Sovereign" painted on her sides.
