Thereas We are informed. That divers Resiments, Troops and Companies, are, contrary to Our Intentions, Quartered in Private Hoifes; We have thought fit hereby to diclare Out Pleafure to be, That none of

fit hereby to diclare Our Pleafure to be, That none of the Forces, of what Nation or Quality Joever, fhall prefume to quarter in any Private House, without the free and wommary Confert of the Owner, and that all Houses be Deemed Paivate House, except Volualling Houses, and Houses of Publick Entertainment, or fuch as fell Wine, or any other Liquor by Retil: In which Houses, We do think fit, that all Officers and Soldiens be Lodged by the Direction and Appointment of the Chief Magistrates, Justices of the Peace, or Constables of the Place, phere any Forces shall cover, and not otherwise 5. And We do hereby strictly forbid all Officers and Soldiers, upon any tretence mbatfocver, to take up any Quarters for themselves or others, without Juch Direction or Appointment, upon paix of being Cafaiered, or fuffering fuch other Puniforment as the Offence faall deferve.

Vienna, Decemb. 26. The first instant we had advice, that a French Party of Hoise and Dragoous, of the Garilon of Manaz, commanded by the Sietir de B exeche, having patted the Roine on a Bridge of Boats, had primered several Villages in Wetteravia; Whereupon the Count de Lippe marched Jinnediately with a Detachement from hence to cut off their Retreat; But in his march he was informed that the French were returned to Mentz.

Francfort, Jan. 6. We hear the French have, upon the approach of the Troops of Saxon, quitted Haulbron, having full plundered and let Fire to the Town.

Cologne, Decemb. 31. The French have begun to lay the Foundations of the Bridge they intend to build over the Rhine at Bon; For the Security whercof they will raife a Redoubt on the fide of Bergues. They ftop at Bon all the Veffels that are bound to this place. The Cardinal of Einflemberg has defired of these Magistrates that he may come hither, for a few days, with his Guards; But they have refuted it. They write from Manbeim, of the 26th instant, that the French had began to demolifh the Fortifications of that place, having fuminioned in 4000 Country People for that work, who were obliged to provide themselves with Provifions for 15 days; And that the Cannon and Ammunition would be carried from thence to Mentz.

Coligne, Jan. 3. Yefterday arrived here 400 Brandenburgh Horfe; And more Troops are daily expected to reinforce this Gailfon; Which may be, then throng enough to oblige the French to retire out of the Dutchies of Juliers and Bergues. The Altington, latt Night marched from hence 300 Mey, ich Orders to put themselves into Duleidorp, upon which place Wallingford it's believed the French have fome delign,

Luge, Jan, 8. A Party of Maeftricht has defeated three Troops of French Hörfe on this fide Cologne. They write from Germany, that the French have quitted Hailbron. And that the Emperor had ordered 4 Regiments more to march towards the Empire.

Paris, January 15. The King has given the Govern-ment of Gurenne to the Count de Talefe, Admiral of France; Ment of Guyenne to the Count at aggres norminator crance; And the Marefchal de Lorges is appointed to perform the Functions of Governor during his Minority. The French fortifie Mentz with all possible diligence; And, it's faid, they will quit the places they have at prefent Gariforts in on the other fide of the Rhine.
