

out of the Dutchie of *Juvers* and *Bergues*. The last Night marched from hence 300 Men, in Orders to put themselves into *Dufeldorp*, upon which place it's believed the French have some design.

Luge, Jan. 8. A Party of *Maestricht* has defeated three Troops of French Horse on this side *Cologne*. They write from *Germany*, that the French have quitted *Hailbron*. And that the Emperor had ordered 4 Regiments more to march towards the Empire.

Paris, January 15. The King has given the Government of *Guyenne* to the Count de *Talost*, Admiral of *France*; And the *Marschal de Lorges* is appointed to perform the Functions of Governor during his Minority. The French fortifie *Mentz* with all possible diligence; And, it's said, they will quit the places they have at present Garrisoned in on the other side of the *Rhine*. There has been a Rencounter between the Germans and some of our Troops near that River, in which a Detachment of the Regiment of *Piedmont* suffered very much, and the Lieutenant-Colonel was killed. The Marquis de *Feuquières* is made Governor of the City of *Bordeaux*. The Duke of *Luxemburg* is gone to *Poitou* to command a Body of Troops on that side.
