A DECLARATION.

Hereas We have been given to under-fland, That several Untrue and Groundless Reports have been of late industriously spread among the Sea-men of the Fleet, touching the Incertainty of their Receiving the Wages due to them for their Service therein, to the Occasioning great Discontents and Disorders within the said Fleet; We out of the just Regard which We do and shall always bear to the Satisfaction and Encouragement of the Seamen of this Kingdom, have thought fit hereby to declare, That as well the Arrears already due, as the growing Wages of all and every Officer and Seaman feroing Us in the Said Fleet, shall be fully made good to them, according to the known Methods of the Navy, so soon as the Ships whereon they have or shall respectively Earn the same, shall be brought in and laid up.

And whereus among other the ill effects of the Reports beforementioned, One is, That several Scamen have been thereby mifled to the absenting themselves from their Ships without Leave, and thereby subjecting themselves to the Penalties by the Lams of eke Sea, provided on that behalf. We do hereby further Declare, That all fuch Absenters who stall return to their Duties on Board their respective Ships within the space of Esfeeen days after the Date hereof, final be by Us Pardoned their faid Offence , and exempted from the Punishment by Law due for the fame; And be moreover entitled to the Full Benefit of this Our Deslaration, in reference to their Wages; But so as that tobcever of them Shall be found either Refusing on Neglecting so lay hold of this Our Gracion Offer by a timely return to their Duties as before, foull be diligently fought a ter, and (peine Apprehended) Strictly proceeded against for the Same de Deserters according to Law.

Warfam, Decemb. 18. The Dyet of this Kingdom was opened here Yesterday; and in the first Session the Crown Referentianties Sezuka was unanimously chosen by the Depuries from the several Palasinates to be their Marefehal or Speaker; which good beginning gives great hopes of a happy Success of this Meeting.

Stockholm; Decem. 18. The Troops continue to march towards Schonen; from whence it's believed feveral Regiments will be Transported to the Territories of this Crown in Germany.

Vienna, Dec. 30. The Preparations for the War are continued here with great vigor and application-Repeated Orders are feat to the Imperial Forces to halten their March towards the Empire; and for the reinforcing the Troops that are to remain in Hungary, in case a Peace be not concluded with the Turks, the Emperor has given Directions to add 4 new Companies to every Regiment of Foot, and to make those of Horse tip 1000 each. The Chevalier Proski is daily expected here from Poland, with full Power to enter jointly with the Ministers of his Imperial Majesty, and the Republick of Venice, upon a Treaty with the Turkish Ambassadors, who in the mean time do daily more and more manifest how desirous the Ottoman Port is of a Peaces And indeed all our Advices from Turkey tell us, That they to entirely rely upon the Success of the faid Ambaffadors Negotiation in order thereunto, that they hardly make any Preparations for the War. We are told from Hungary, that 36 Turks of the Garison of Sigeth, of which Number it's faid, is the Baffa Muran, having got out of that place, were come over to the Imperialists, and gave an account that there were still in the Town about 400 Men, able to bear Arms, and 600 Women and Children, but that they were reduced to that Distress, that they could not hold out many days longer. The Count de Zobor has received his Money for the new Levy he has undertaken of 3000 Hungareans; which are to march towards the Empire. The Suife Cantons have affured this Court that they will take care of Reinfelde, and the other Forest Towns.

Zell, Dec. 29. The Dukes of Zell, Hanguer and Wifembuttell, had the last Week a Conference in And it's faid, that among other things they resolved to raise several new Regiments.

Raribonue, Jan. 3. Prince Louis of Baden, who arrived here on Thursday last from Vienna, is gone again from hence, after having had several Confe rences with the Emperors Chief Commissioner at the Dyet, for Municke, to acquaint the Blector of Bavaria with his Imperial Majesties Resolutions in relation to the present Juncture of Affairs, and to concert the necessary Measures with his Electoral Highness thereupon. The Imperial Troops that are come to Egra in Bohemia, have Orders to advance this way, to joyn the Bevarian Forces, and those of the Circles, which are quartered between Dominators. and Ulm, and can quickly draw together and form

a Body of an Army, if occasion require.
