TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS:**

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the Second Class on:—

LIEUTENANT THE HONOURABLE FRANCIS ROBERT SANDILANDS, R.N., of Her Majesty's Ship "Audacious."

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

In latitude 13° 44' N., longitude 58° 29' E., at one o'clock, A.M., of the 1st January, 1875, the ship being under steam, it being at the time dark, and the weather fine and clear, Frederick Cowd, Ship's Corporal of the First Class, fell overboard from the top-gallant fore-castle, and passed aft, apparently unable to help himself.

LIEUTENANT THE HONOURABLE FRANCIS ROBERT SANDILANDS, who had had the first watch, and was at the time on the bridge in conversation with the officer of the middle watch, immediately sprang after the drowning man, from a height of twenty-four feet, swam to him, and kept him above water. Owing to part of the slipping apparatus having been carried away, some delay was occasioned in getting the life-boat clear of the slings, but LIEUTENANT SANDILANDS never ceased his efforts to keep the man above water. Both were eventually picked up, the Ship's Corporal being insensible, and dying soon after being got on board the ship. LIEUTENANT SANDILANDS was unable to reach the life-buoys which had been let go, and he supported the man in the water from twelve to eighteen minutes, never quitting him until he was taken into the boat.

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board under "The Public Health Act, 1872," investing Guardians with Urban Powers :—

Wycombe Union.

Great Marlow and Wendover Parishes.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wycombe Union, in the counties of Buckingham and Oxford, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union:

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the Authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order, to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such Authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Board as to the time, portion of district, or manner during, at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Wycombe Union, in the counties of Buckingham and Oxford, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue an Order investing them, as such Sanitary Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the parishes of Great Marlow and Wendover, both in the Rural Sanitary District of that Union:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Wycombe Union, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the 20th day of March, 1875, with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the said parishes of Great Marlow and Wendover, with reference to making and enforcing bylaws, and otherwise, with respect to the following matters, viz. :—

With respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 32 of the Local Government Act, 1858, so far as the powers under that section are not already conferred upon the said Sanitary Authority in pursuance of Section 8 of the Public Health Act, 1872, and Section 5 of the Sanitary Act, 1868,

And with respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1858, and in Section 44 of the Sanitary Law Amendment Act, 1874.

And We hereby direct the said Guardians to cause this Order to be published once in some newspaper circulated within the Rural Sanitary District of the said Union, before the expiration of one calendar month from the date hereof.

*Alteration in Buoyage, Port Royal.*

INFORMATION has been received from Commodore Algernon F. R. DeHorsey, Senior Officer at Jamaica, that the following alteration has been made in the buoyage at Port Royal, in conformity with the uniform system of buoyage adopted by the Trinity House, London, viz. :—

East Middle buoy, has been changed from black, to *black and white vertical stripes.*

Gun Cay buoy, has been changed from black and white horizontal, to *black and white vertical stripes.*

Rackum Cay buoy, has been changed from black, to *black and white vertical stripes.*

Turtle Head buoy, has been changed from white, to *red and white vertical stripes.*

Harbour Shoal buoy, has been changed from red and white horizontal, to *red.*

Port Royal Spit buoy, has been changed from white to *red.*

Also that a buoy is about to be placed to mark the west side of a small reef which lies N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. one quarter of a mile from Drunkenman's Cay.

[The bearing is magnetic. Variation  $3\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  Easterly in 1875.]

#### Portsmouth Street Tramways Act, 1870.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws have been made by the Council of the borough of Portsmouth, as the Local Authority, in that behalf, under the provisions of the Portsmouth Street Tramways Act, 1870.

1. No carriage shall be driven on the tramway at a greater speed than eight miles an hour.
2. No carriage using the tramways shall follow another carriage at a less distance from such other carriage than 200 yards; and no more than one carriage shall be standing or remain at one time at either terminal station for a longer space than three minutes.

For any breach of either of the two foregoing Bye-laws the driver of a carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

3. Carriages shall not run on the tramways, except between eight o'clock in the morning and twelve o'clock in the evening, from the 1st day of October to the last day of March following, and between 7 o'clock in the morning and twelve o'clock in the evening from the 1st day of April to the last day of September. Provided that on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, or any day set apart for a Public Fast or Thanksgiving, no carriage shall ply or run on the tramways before one o'clock in the afternoon, and on those days no carriage shall run oftener than once every half-hour from either terminal station, or any intermediate point.

For any breach of the last foregoing Bye-law, the Company shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
