(Additional Provisions authorising-1st. Alterations in Powers granted by "The Metropolitan Board of Works Act, 1874," in respect of the Finsbury Park, and the making of New Roads in substitution of part of authorised Road. 2nd. Vesting in Middlesex Justices land fronting the Clerkenwell Sessions House, and con-sequent alteration of Works authorised by, and amendment of, the Metropolitan Street Improvements Act, 1872. 3rd. Enabling the two Societies of the Inner and Middle Temple to extend their line of frontage in making improvement at Harcourt and Plowden Buildings beyond line authorised by the 28th Section of "The Thames Embankment Act, 1862."

OTICE is hereby given, that the Metropolitan Board of Works (who are herein
referred to as "The Board") are applying to
Parliament in the present session for leave to
introduce into the Metropolitan Board of Works (Various Powers) Bill, now referred to a Select Committee of the Honourable the House of Commons, all such powers as may be necessary for effecting the following or some of the following obiects:

Finsbury Park.

1. To repeal in part and otherwise to amend the provisions or some of the provisions of the Metropolitan Board of Works Act, 1874, relating to the new road authorised and the powers conferred by that Act with reference to such road.

2. To authorise the abandonment of so much of the new road at Finsbury Park authorised by the said Act of 1874, as is situate in the parish of Hornsey, in the county of Middlesex, between the authorised commencement of the said road in the Seven Sisters'-road and the existing road bridge over the Great Northern Railway on the west side of Finsbury Park.
