We have thought fit hereby to declare the same, that no Officer or Soldier may be missed, or diverted from Our Service by any groundless Reports, or malicious Instinuations, strictly Charging and Requiring all Officers to repair forthwith to their respective Commands, and all Soldiers to their refective Commands, and all Soldiers to their refective Commands, and all Soldiers to their default as the Nature of their Officers shall deserve. And if it shall so happen, that notwithstanding these Our Gracious Intentions and Officer of Pardon for their past Absence or Desertion and Soldiers shall abstinately continue to absent themselves from their Duties, We do hereby Direct and Apprehending of all Soldiers that have deserved, or shall deserve all Officers Civil and Military to Seize and Apprehending of all Soldiers that have deserved, or shall deserve the Service, in order to the bringing them so Soudayn Punishment, to be institled upon them with the utmost Severity.

Paris, Jan. 26. There is a Discourse of raising 50 new froops of Dragoons, and of adding 200 Men to the Guards du Corps, and 20 to each Company in the Regiment of Guards. The Mareschal de Lorge is going to Command in Guyenne, and the Mareichal d'Estrees in Brueny. It's said that the 1300 Bales of Silk that were lately taken in the Dutch Merchant Ship, which came from Alexandria, do almost, all belong to the Merchants of this City, Lyon and Tours.
The Sieur Gabares put to Sea the last Week with
the Squadron under his Command, but the ill weather forced him into Port again.

St. James's, Jan. 21.
