*Intended Alteration in Buoyage of the Wallet.*

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that in consequence of alterations which have taken place in the sands at the southern end of the Wallet, the following alteration in the buoyage will be made as soon as possible, viz. :—

Wallet Spitway Buoy will be moved E. by N. 2 cables, and will be surmounted by a staff and *St. Andrew's Cross*, instead of a diamond, as at present.

Whitaker Buoy will be increased in size, and surmounted by a staff and diamond.

A new 6 feet can buoy will be placed on the north elbow of the Eagle Sand.

*Intended Alteration in Maplin Light.*

Also, that coincidentally with the above changes in the buoyage, the following alteration will be made in the Maplin Light, viz. :—

A strip of white light will be exhibited to the south-eastward so as to cut the Maplin Spit Buoy.
