The Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal granting the dignity of a Baronet of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto Walter Barttelot Barttelot, of Stopham, in the county of Sussex, Esq., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten.

Westminster, May 28, 1875.

THIS day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to amend the law relating to regimental exchanges.

An Act to amend the Sea Fisheries Act, 1869.

An Act to amend and continue certain Acts for the preservation of the peace in Ireland, and to grant an indemnity in certain cases.

An Act for empowering the Local Board for the district of Southend, in the county of Essex, to purchase the pier there, and for other purposes.

An Act for conferring further powers on the Eastbourne Waterworks Company for the construction and maintenance of works, and otherwise in relation to their undertaking, and for regulating their share and loan capital; and for other purposes.

An Act for better supplying the borough of Maidenhead and other places in Berkshire with water.

An Act conferring further powers on the Torbay and Brixham Railway Company.

An Act to authorise the Carmarthen Gas Company to raise additional capital, to confer further powers on them; and for other purposes.
