Venice, Jan. 3.

HE Jast Letters from the Morea gave an Account, That the Doge Morolini had fixed his Head Quarter at Napoli di Romania; And that he was making Preparations in order to renew the Siege of Negrepone, to foon as the Season is proper for it; Having, in the mean time, ordered a Squadron of Ships to cruife about that Island to hinder their receiving any Succors by Sea. The Senate have given out divers. Commissions for new Levies, and other Officers are treating with for the same purpose: But this lessens not the Discourses of Peace, which those, that pretend to know most of Affairs, do not think to be ill grounded. General Cornaro has leave to return from Dalmatia, but, before he quits that Government, he is to take care that the Troops receive all the Pay that's due to them; To which end a confiderable Sum of Money will be forthwith fent to him from hence. We hear, by the way of Ragusa, that the Grand Signior was resolved to continue all this Winter at Adrianople; And that, to fatisfic the Soldiers, it was given out, that he would himself go into the Field the next Summer; Of which there was however very little appearance, considering the present state of that Empire, which, by the Losses sustained during the War, the Disorders among the Troops that remain, and the Revolt in Afia, is reduced to such a Condition as not to be able to bear the War any longer. These Advices say, that Ofman Oglu Bassa, who had been sent with 4000 Men to suppress those that are in Arms in Afia, was joined with them; That several other Bassa's had done the like, and that they had all Correspondencies with Teghen Bassa, who continued with the Troops he had with him about Nissa. The Convoy defigned for the Levant will fail in few days.

Genoua, Jan. 4. On the first instant the five new Senators took Possession of their Offices with the accustomed Solemnity. They write from Florence, that the Princess of Bavaria was arrived at Protolino, and that she would make, the 9th instant, her publick Entry into that City. By a Vessel come in nine days from Argiers, we have advice, that 10 of their Men of War were returned home with several French Prizes. And that those People had already rebuilt most of the Houses that were ruined by the French Bombs the Last Summer.

Leghorne, Jan. 10. By a Felucca come from Patermo we have advice, that the French have carried into Messina a Dutch Merchant Ship very richly laden from the Levant.

Vienna, Jan. 9. The Imperial Troops march, with all the diligence possible, towards the Empire,

where they will form an Army of 35000 Men; and be ready to take the Field by the end of March. The Turkish Ambassadors will, in sew days, have Audience of the Emperor, after which the Imperial Ministers, and those of Poland and Venice; will enter into a Negotiation with them; And there is little doubt made but a Peace will be suddenly concluded. The Fortisications of Belgrade are sinisfied as far as the Season will permit: And several Forts are going to be built for the greater Security of the new Conquelts on that side.

Vienna, Jan. 16. The States of the Lower Aufria affembled here on Monday laft; The Emperor being present and seated on his Throne, the Chancellor Seraetman made a Speech to them, declaring the great Victories and Conquests with which it had pleased God to bless the Imperial Arms during the course of the last Campagne, and the vast Expense his Imperial Majesty had been at in repairing the Fortifications, providing Magazines, and reinforcing his Troops, not only for the continuing these happy Progresses against the Infidels, but for the opposing the Hostilities of the French, who had, during the Truce, without any foregoing Declaration of War, attack dthe Empire, and possessed themselves of divers Places and Counties, which they had ravaged and de-ftroyed with Fire and Sword, in a most barbarous manner; And that his Imperial Majetty did therefore expect from them (the faid States,) a Supply proportionable to the present Exigency of Affairs. The 12th instant arrived here the Baron Karaniski, Envoy Extraordinary from Poland; And the 14 he had Audience of the Emperor: To which the Turkish Ambassadors will now be likewise admitted in a day or two: In the mean time the Sieur Hop, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General of the United Provinces, has, as Mediator, had a Conference with the faid Ambassadors, who do offer not only Satisa faction to the Emperor, but likewife to his Allier. We have advice, that the Cham of Tartary, and Sultan Nuradin, who were advancing with two great Bodies towards Hungary and Transilvania, had been obliged to return home, having understood that the Moscovites and Cossacks were sallen into the Crim Tartary. The Emperor has this week given out Commissions for the raising three new Regiments

Seingard, Jan. 8. Upon the advice of the approach of 6000 men of the Troops of the Circles, the French who had been here 12 days, retired in fome diforder. The havock they have made here in 60 thort a time can hardly be expressed, and besides their other Exactions, they forced the Inhabitants to pay 52000 Crowns; and at their departure blew up part of the Ramparts, and would have done the like with the Castle, but that they wanted time, having notice that the Germani-were come within 3

hours march of this place, under the command of the Marquis or Bacen Dourlach; They arrived here foon after, and fent out immediately a Party of Horfe and Dragoous, who overtaking the Enemy, deleated some Troops of their Rear-guard, and took the Baggage of the Marquis de Lufgnan, and several Officers. It's faid that their Foot being furprized at Constat, above 400 were killed upon the place. They have likewife abandoned Ansborg.

Genzen, Jan. 19. The Proops of Bavarta are on their maich towards the Dutchy of Wintemberg. The Lieutenant-General Baron de Steinau, and the Count de la Tour and Taffis, General of Battalia, arrived here the 16th instant, with several other principal Officers, and parted again from hence the 18th to join the faid Forces: Before their departure they had advice, that the French were encamped, to the number of 8000 Men, at Powedshein, with a defign

to return to Sturgard.

Ulm, Jan. 19. The Elector of Bavaria, who parted from Munick the 15th instant, arrived here yesterday, and this day about Noon went from hence for Nirlingen, to join the main Body of his Forces, and the Train of Artillery, with which his Electoral Highness intends to march towards Wirtemberg with all the hafte he can; the French threatening to ravage that Dutchy and the Neighbouring Coun-

Nuremberg, Jan. 21. The Lieutenant-General Count de Souches arrived here the 16th instant, to demand passage through Franconia for the Imperial Troops that are marching towards the Rhine; Of which two Regiments took their march the 18th towards the Necker, and four towards Suabia; And the rest, who are encamped not far from hence, will Mortly follow. Prince Louis of Baden parted from this place the 20th instant on his return to Ratubonne; And the Count de Souches towards Suabia, to command, under the Elector of Bavaria, the Imperial Forces that are marched that way, French have resolved to dismantle Frankendal, and

all the other Towns of the Palatinate.
• Francfore, Jan. 13. The French Troops have quitted Hylbron, after having plundered the Town, and blown up the Gates, and part of the VValls; They carried away with them 4 Hostages for the Payment of the remaining part of the Tax of 50000 Crowns which they had laid upon the Inhabitants: About 2 or three hours after their departure, a Regiment of Dragoons of the Troops of Saxony entred the place, which has been fince relieved by another of Foot. The French have likewise flighted Offembourg, and continue to demolish Manheim. A French Party of the Garison of Mentz have burnt Oberradt, a Village belonging to this City.

Francfirt, Jan. 25. VVe hear from Heylbron, that 8000 Saxons are advanced towards the Necker; And that they had taken a French Lieutenant-Colonel, who was retiring from Eberhach with 12000 Crowns in Money. The Elector of Bavaria is marching at the Head of his Troops towards the Country of Wirtemberg.

Mussfricht, Jan. 5. Our Parties have put part of the County of Chim, and of the Dutchy of Luxembourg; under Contribution; And make their Incurions as far as Mabeuge in the Country of Haynault.

Eruffels, Jan. 22. The new Levies of Horse, Foot, and Dragoons, that are making for the fervice of these Countries, advance with good success. We hear from Liege, that an Envoy was arrived there from France, to fee the Treaty lately concluded at Paru, by the Count de Greslech, put in execution; and that he required to have the Cittadel of Lacge demolished within 24 hours. They write from Holland, that of the 6000 Suedes that are to put into the service of the States General, 3000 were already arrived within the Dutch Territories, and the reit were daily expected. All our Letters from France speak of the great preparations that are making there for the VVar.

Bruffels, Febr. 1. The Letters from Germany give an Account, That the Elector of B. varia was marching with 20000 Men towards the Dutchy of Wirtimberg; and, that the French Troops had thereupon quitted feveral Places with great precipitation. Our Governor General has given Orders for the providing a great Magazine at Mons, and another at Namur. The Cittadel of Liege is not

yet demolished.
