THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Tangier, reporting that the exportation of the intestines of animals will in future be permitted at Moorish ports on payment of an export duty of 20 okeats per cantar, at the rate of $34\frac{1}{2}$ okeats to the Spanish dollar and $32\frac{1}{2}$ okeats to the French 5-franc piece.
