WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of one hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of the Holy Trinity, Hinckley, in the county of Leicester, and in the diocese of Peterborough, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of the Holy Trinity, Hinckley, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of one hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of the Holy Trinity, Hinckley.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of certain tithe commutation rent-charges, amounting in the aggregate to seventy-two pounds four shillings and ten pence, which have been permanently secured to the vicarage of Hound, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, and of a further benefaction, consisting of two hundred and seventy-two pounds and four shillings, which has been paid to us in favour of the same vicarage, and in respect of which we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the said vicarage, and to his successors, a yearly sum of nine pounds one shilling and four pence, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Hound, and to his successors, to meet the aforesaid benefactions, one other yearly sum or stipend of fifty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the yearly

sum or stipend, so payable out of our common fund as lastly herein-mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Appledore with the chapelry of Ebony annexed, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Canterbury, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage and chapelry, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us: To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with their appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments expressed to be hereby granted and conveyed, shall be, and be taken to be, in lieu of, and in substitution for, a portion, amounting to ten pounds, of the annual sum or stipend of thirty pounds, formerly paid by the Archbishoprick of Canterbury, and latterly by us, the said Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage and chapelry, to which substitution the Reverend Mark Dyer French, Clerk, Incumbent of the said vicarage and chapelry, is consenting, and, in token thereof, has signed this instrument: And provided also, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage and chapelry shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments for and in respect of the period intervening between the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.
