(No. 101.)—SOUTH AMERICA—WEST COAST—PATAGONIA.

*Reported Sunken Rock North of Mount Corso Island.*

INFORMATION has been received from Mr. Robert B. Williams, commanding the Pacific Navigation Company's ship *Cotopaxi*, that when running down the coast between the Gulfs of Peñas and Trinidad, the vessel passed within one mile of a sunken rock. From the nature of the sea which was breaking, it was supposed that the rock was about 10 or 12 feet under water and in calm weather probably would not break. Commander Williams has assigned the position of this sunken rock to be in lat. 49° 30' S., long. 75° 40' W., but the weather did not admit of reliable bearings or observations.

*Alteration in Lights at Dome-ness.*

*Camisone Rock*, with 3 feet on it at low water, lies N.N.W.  $2\frac{3}{4}$  miles from Hime-sima. Approximate position, lat.  $32^{\circ} 50' 45''$  N., long.  $128^{\circ} 40' 10''$  E.

There is also said to be a dangerous rock at the north entrance of Fukuye Channel, lying N.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a mile from the north-east point of Camono Chima Islets. Approximate position, lat.  $32^{\circ} 49' 20''$  N., long.  $128^{\circ} 47'$  E.
