SIR, *Hermopolis, July 5, 1875.*

I HAVE the honour to inform you that my Government having received information that cholera has appeared on the coast as well as the interior of Syria, has ordered that commencing from the 1st instant, all arrivals from the coast of Syria, from the town of Ghaza to Alexandretta, shall be subjected to a quarantine of eleven days.
