THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Caracas reporting that by a Decree of the Venezuelan Government of the 17th June last, the Maritime Custom-house for coasting trade recently transferred from Maracaibo to the Fortress of San Carlos, has been removed back to Maracaibo.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs two Despatches from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at Malaga, reporting that the following taxes have been imposed on goods shipped and landed at that port, for the purpose of raising funds for deepening and improving the harbour:—

On goods to or from colonies and foreign countries other than European, 688 milesimas of a peseta (about 6½d.) per Spanish ton of 1000 kilogrammes; and on goods to or from European countries, 575 milesimas of a peseta (about 5½d.) per ton.

Also a further tax, subsequently imposed for the same purpose, ranging from 4 to 35 cents. of a peseta per 100 kilogrammes, or from 4d. to 2s. 11d. per ton on all merchandise shipped and landed.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of

a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, reporting that owing to the disease which has ravaged the province of Salonica, the Turkish Government have prohibited the exportation of cattle from thence during one year, dating from the 13th ultimo. Contracts, however, if regularly proved to have been made before that date, may be carried out for one month after.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Portuguese Authorities at Lisbon, declaring Bangkok and all other ports of the Kingdom of Siam free from cholera morbus since the 23rd May last.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Constantinople, stating that owing to the continued alarming manifestations of cholera in Syria, the Cyprus Board of Health have ordered that passengers from Syria shall perform their quarantine whenever the vessel can remain in port, that cases of sickness will be put into isolated localities, and that during the time that quarantine is kept up all the occupants of houses surrounding the lazant must quit them.
