**NOTICE TO MARINERS.**

(No. 118.)—NORWAY—CHRISTIANIA FIORD.

*Light on Dynen Rock.*

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that on the 9th August, 1875, a light was exhibited from a wooden building painted white, on Dynen Rock, Christiania Fiord; the light will be exhibited from the 15th July to 31st May, of the following year, except when the Fiord is covered with ice.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 18 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles, between the bearings of W. by S., through west and north to E.N.E., the former bearing leading to the southward of Herbergene, and the latter to the southward of Vasholm Fluene.

The illuminating apparatus is of the sixth order.

In thick weather a bell will be sounded fifteen times: then be followed by a short interval.

Position as given, lat. 59° 53' 40" N., long. 10° 41' 55" E.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 15° Westéry in 1875.]

NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of the tonnage bounty awarded for a slave dhow, name unknown, captured on the 26th May, 1874, by Her Majesty's ship "Vulture," will commence on Tuesday, the 14th instant, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, Newstreet, Spring-gardens, S.W."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person, who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to the Accountant-General of the Navy and Comptroller of Navy Pay, Admiralty, London, S.W." (enclosing his certificate of service, or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers),—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.
