

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Northumberland, holden at Newcastle.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against Lauritz Gjemre, of Bulman's Village, in the county of Northumberland, and carrying on business at Exchange-buildings, King-street, within the borough and county of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, as Shipbroker and Merchant, under the style or firm of Lauritz Gjemre and Co., and formerly carrying on business in copartnership with James Pigdon Taylor, of Newcastle-upon-Tyne aforesaid, Merchant, under the said style or firm of Lauritz Gjemre and Co.
