##### GENERAL ORDER.

Suspension in part of General Order :  
Medical Officer's Fees.

Luton Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Luton Union, in the Counties of Bedford and Hertford ;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the poor within certain Unions, including the Luton Union,

in the counties of Bedford and Hertford ; and by Articles 177, 178, 179, 180, 181, 182, and 183 of the said Order, provision was made for the payment of special fees to District Medical Officers in certain cases ;

And whereas by a General Order of the Local Government Board dated the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and addressed to the said Union amongst others, the proviso contained in Article 178 above recited was rescinded, and another proviso was substituted for it ;

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the Articles above referred to as respects the Medical Officers of the said Luton Union ;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend the operation, with respect to the said Luton Union, of Articles 177, 179, 180, 181, 182, and 183 of the first above-recited Order, and of Article 178 of that Order as amended by the said General Order of the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, until the Local Government Board shall, by an Order under their Seal of Office, otherwise direct.

*Exhibition of Light on El Roque.*

INFORMATION has been received from Her Britannic Majesty's Consul at Caracas that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected by the Venezuelan Government on the N.E. Hill (150 feet high) of El Roque.

The light is a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy *once every minute*, it is elevated 208 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 18 miles.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 124.)—COCHIN CHINA.

*Reported Rock off Cape Ti-wan.*

INFORMATION has been received from Her Majesty's Consul at Saigon, of the existence of a rock, lying in a south-easterly direction from Cape Ti-wan, and on which the British steam vessel "Pernambuco" (drawing 15 feet) struck, on her voyage from Hong Kong to Saigon, on the 18th June, 1875.

This rock (Pernambuco Rock) appeared to be about 40 feet in extent, but as the ship merely struck and passed over no soundings were taken on it.

The rock was, however, subsequently searched for in a boat, but no bottom was found at ten fathoms.

The position assigned to the rock by the master of the "Pernambuco" is  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles S.E. by S. from Cape Ti-wan; this places the rock in latitude  $10^{\circ} 19' 18''$  N., longitude  $107^{\circ} 16' 18''$  E.

NOTE.—As the position of this reported danger is uncertain, vessels should not approach Cape Ti-wan nearer than six miles, nor shoal the soundings to less than eleven fathoms at low water, until further particulars are known.
