With respect to the above matters relating to stores which are licensed for the keeping of gunpowder with other explosive, or for the keeping of other explosive than gunpowder, whether with or without gunpowder; hereinalter referred to as stores licensed for mixed explosives, the Secretary of State proposes to recommend to Her. Majesty that, in pursuance of the above men, tioned provisions of the Act, Her Majesty may be pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy. Council to order and prescribe as follows :--

Proposed Order of Secretary of State making Bye-laws as to the Conveyance, Loading, and Unloading of Explosives.

Whereas by Part I (section 37) of the Explosives Act, 1875 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), it is provided that a Secretary of State may from time to time make bye-laws for regulating the conveyance, loading, and unloading of gunpowder, in any case in which bye-laws made under any other provision of the Act do not apply, and in particular for declaring or regulating all or any of the matters therein following ;

And whereas by Part II (section 39) of the Act it is declared that, subject to the provisions thereafter in Part II of the Act contained, Part I of the Act relating to gunpowder shall apply to every other description of explosive in like manner as if the provisions of such Part I were re-enacted in such Part II, with the substitution of that descrip-

tion of explosive for gunpowder : The Secretary of State proposes, in pursuance of the aforesaid provisions of the Act, to order that the following bye-laws shall be observed with respect to the conveyance, loading, or unloading of gunpowder and other explosives in any case, in which bye-laws made under any provision of the Act other than section 37 do not apply :-

1. Explosive shall not be conveyed in a carriage, ship, or boat whilst carrying or plying for public passengers, unless the quantity be less than 5 lbs., and notice has been given beforehand to the person in charge of such carriage, ship, or Ton ni Z




