ORDERS of the Local Government Board for the Appointment of Auditors for the Cornwall and West Devonshire and Essex Audit Districts:—

- To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions comprised in the Cornwall and West Devonshire Audit District;
- To the Guardians of the Poor of the parish of East Stonehouse, comprised in the said district;
- To the Guardians of the Poor of the Incorporation of the Town of Plymouth, comprised in the said district;
- To the Commissioners acting in execution of the Local Act for the Relief of the Poor in the Parish of Stoke Damarel, comprised in the said district;
- To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parishes and Places comprised in the said several Unions, and of the said Parishes of East Stonehouse and Stoke Damarel;
- To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Incorporation of the Town of Plymouth;
- To Charles Alfred Dawson, Esquire, of Teignmouth, in the county of Devon;
- And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the statutes in that behalf, hereby appoint Charles Alfred Dawson, of Teignmouth, in the county of Devon, Barrister-at-Law, to be the Auditor for the Cornwall and West Devonshire Audit District, in the place of Northmore Herle Pierce Lawrence, Esquire, who has resigned, and to discharge the duties required of such Auditor by the Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the twenty-third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and by all Orders of the Poor Law Board and of the Local Government Board, and the several statutes applicable to that office.
