## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 144.)—MALACCA STRAIT—NORTH ENTRANCE.

*Revolving Light near Acheen Head.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 115, dated 12th August, 1875, on the intended establishment of a light on the north point of Pulo Brasse, near Acheen Head, at the north-west end of Sumatra Island:—

The Netherlands Government has given further notice that the light is now exhibited.

The light is a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, and so continuing nine seconds. It is visible between the bearings of E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N. (through south and west) and N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., elevated 525 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 30 miles.

Within the distance of 12 miles a faint light appears between that of the greatest brilliancy.

The illuminating apparatus is of the first order. The tower, 120 feet high, is painted white to a height of 98 feet, and above that height red. Position, lat. 5° 44' 20" N., long. 95° 9' 10" E.

*Auxiliary Light to above.*

Also, that within a few months it is intended to exhibit a *fixed red* light of the fourth order from the above light tower on Pulo Brasse, at a height of 26 feet above the ground. This light will be visible through an arc of 90 degrees, its central part passing over the north-west islet. The light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to this outlying islet. In clear weather it should be seen from distance of 12 miles.

And that further notice will be given of the exhibition of this auxiliary light.
