BYE-LAWS made by the Corporation of the Borough of Leicester at a Quarterly Meeting of the Council, held the 28th September, 1875, in respect of the Tramways constructed by the Leicester Tramways Company Limited, within the said Borough.

HEREAS by Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, the Local Authority of any district in which any tramway is laid down is empowered, subject to the approval of the Board of Trade, to make certain regulations as to such tramways, and for enforcing the observance of all or any of such regulations, to make bye-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the first part of such section, provided that such bye-laws be not repugnant to the laws of that part of the United Kingdom where the same are to have effect. And by Section 47 of the same Act it is enacted that any such bye-laws may impose reasonable penalties for offences against the same. not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, with or without further penalties for continuing offences, not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for each day during which the offence continues; but that all bye-laws shall be so framed so as to allow in every case part only of

the maximum penalty being ordered to be paid.

And whereas the said Company have constructed tramways as authorized by the said Act, and commenced to use tramway carriages on all

tramways so constructed.

Now, in pursuance of the powers given by the said Acts, and of every other power enabling them thereto, and subject to the approval of the Board of Trade, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough, acting by the Council of the said borough as the Local Authority of such borough, make and ordain under their common seal hereto annexed the following bye-laws, namely,—

The expression "carriages" or "carriage" in these bye-laws shall respectively mean carriages or carriage with flanged wheels, or wheels suitable only to run on rails, and used on the tramway; and the expression "Company" shall mean the Leicester Tramways Company Limited, or other the proprietors for the time being of the said

tramways.

1. The carriages of the Company shall be driven at a rate not less than five miles; and not

more than eight miles in the hour.

2. No carriage shall follow a preceding carriage at a less distance than eighty yards along any portion of the line of tramway (sidings excepted). For any offence against this and the preceding bye-law the driver of the carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

These bye-laws shall come into force on the

1st day of December, 1875.

Bre-Laws and Regulations made by the Corporation of the Borough of Leicester as the Local Authority of the said Borough at a Quarterly Meeting of the Council, held the 28th September, 1875, under the Powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Public Health Act, 1875.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Tramways Act, 1870, the Local Authority of any district in which any tramway is laid down has the same power of making and enforcing
