Vienna, Jan. 23. The 24th Inftant arrived there an Officer from the Blockade of Sigeth, with an Account, That the Garifon of that Fortrefs, after having fuffered the atmost extremity, had at laft Capitulated on the 15th Inftant; That Ho-ftages being thereupon given on both fides, the Capitulation was foon after Concluded upon the Came Conditions that were granted to those of Alba Regain ;" And, that two Aga's are coming inther with the Articles to follicite the Emperors Ratification thereof: It's hoped that Canija and Great Waradin will quickly fullow this Example. It was by a general Conclusion of the Three Colledges agreed upon the 24th Inftant; and that King declared an Enemy of the Empire : Since which an Imperial Mandate has been published here, at Aufbourg, and other Places, forbidding all Commerce with the Subjects of that Crown. The Baron de Gallenfalts, Amballador of Prince Clement of Basaria, Archbilhop and Elector of Cologne, took his place yefterday for the first time in the Electoral Colledge.

Francfort, Jan. 31. The French upon notice that fome Bawarian Troops were marching so-The French upon notice wards Pforgheim, have abondoned that Place, having first plundered and set fire to the Town. They have demolished Offembourg, and the Catile of Giroleccle; and all the other finall Places which they lately policifed themfeives of on that fide are expecting the fame Treatment. They have undermined the great Tower of the Cattle of Fig-de berg, the fort called the Searr, and the Gate of Spire, which, its believed, are by this time blown up. They are preparing a great number of Bombes and Cascuffer at Meniz. Bombes and Carcaffes at Meniz

Hambourg, Jan 31. They write from Min-den, that the Elector of Brandenb irg was going from thence to Confer with the Princes of Lu-nenburg and Branfaricke at Hanouer. The Sieur de Gravel, the French Envoy, endeavours to perfuade the Bishop of Munfter to declare for a Nettraining the sump or *Numper* to declare for a Neu-trainity, but there is little appearance of his flice-ceeding therein. The King of Denmark having Ordered federal Regiments to advance towards the Elbe, the Duke of Zell has likewife caufed forme Troops to move that way, to observe them. Princes of Lumenburg, with good fuccels. Cologie, Febr. 4. We have Advice, that a Detachement of French Troops, have, atter an Affault of five hours, taken the Caftle of Monjou. in the Dutchy of Juliers: The Commandant retired with fome Meninto a Tower, where he made a Capitulation, but it was not obferved by the French, who notwithstanding detained his Men as Prifoners of War. The French Forces are drawing together on the Mofelle, with a defign, as it's believed, to attack Coblentz. The Count de Monital, Governor of Mont-Royal, lies there very dangeroully ill. The Troops of Munfter and Paderborne- arrived here the first of this Month, fo that there is now a very good Garifon in this City.

Cologue, Febr. 7: We had Advice two days ago, that General Schoning was marched from Wefel with 6000 Men and eight Pieces of Cannon; and we hear fince, that he is come to Weerden on the River Reer, and that from thence he would continue his march towards Wiperfurt, to cover the Country of Marke against the Enemies Incurfions. They write from Spire of the 3d Instant, that the French in Garifon there had begun to demolish the Walls of that City, and that the Inhabitants furfered extreanly under their exceffive Exactions. In the Neighbouring Countries the Mifery was yet greater, the French Soldiers plundering the Towns and Bourgs, which they were-forced to quit, and deftroying what they could not carry away with them.

Liege, Febr. 9. The Ratification of the Treaty of Neutrality concluded with the Crown of France, being brought hither the first Instant from Park, the Mines that had been made under our Cittadel were forthwith charged, and the 4th Instant at Night four of them were fired, and feveral others the next day, which have demolished the whole Cittadel except one Bastion, and the Works before it, that are to remain standing, and in which there will be possed a finial Garifon. It's expected the French should now likewise quit Hay and the other Places they have made themfelves Maiters of in this Country.

Bruffels, Febr. 4. Our Governor General has given Orders for the preparing a Train of Artillery, with the Wégons for Ammunition, Provifions and Baggage; and to erect Magazinesin all the Frontier Places. It's faid likewife, that a Bridge of Boats will be laid over the Schelde at Antwerp, for the paffage of our Troops The Count de Vallatine, Lieutenant General of the Foreign Horie, is come back from Have, where he had been to fee the new Regiment of Horie commanded by the Duke de Cros. It's faid, that his Excellency fo foon as he receives the fupply he expects from Stain, will raife fix Regimentsmore. The French have taken the Caltle of Monjou in the Dutchy of Julies. General Schoning mached from Wejel the 2d Inftant with 6000 Brandenburgers, and having paffed the Roer, advanced towards Sibourg in the Dutchy of Bergues, to oblige the French to quit that place.

Bruffels, Febr. 11. His Excellency is going to re-inforce his three Troops of Guards to 150 Men each, and the other three, viz. of the General of the Horfe, and the two Lieutenant Generals, to 120 each. The new Regiment Commanded by the Prince de Sceinbuije has país'd Muster ; it is composed of 16 Troops of Dragoons, 40 Men in cach; That of the Maistre de Camp d'Aquero is likewise compleat. We hear from Liege, that they had at laft demolifhed their Cittadel; and, that the French had quitted Huy, and the other Places they were Mafters of in that Country, except Chinay. The French are drawing an Army together on the Molelle; and, it's faid, their de-fign is to Attack Coblentz. Their Troops on this fide are to rendezvous the 1 oth of the next Month between the Sambre and the Meufe. The Letters from Germany fay, that the Elector of Bavaria was marching on fome confiderable Enterprize. The French had a defign to ravage the Countries of Juliers and Bergues, but the march of the Brandenburgers under the Command of General Schoning, prevented the execution of it. We hear from Vienna, that Sigeth was furrendered to the Imperialifts,

Para, Febr. 12. The King went the Sth Inflant to Marli; where he ftill continues. Divers Officers of the Troops of the Houthold are come hither, where they have leave to flay till the Sth of the next Month, when they are to return to their Commands. There is a Report, that the French have quitted the *Palatinate*, and the Marquifate of *Baden*, after having quite tuined those Countries.
