THE Queen has been pleased to present the Reverend Adam Clarke Rowley, M.A., to the Vicarage of Sutterton, in the county and diocese of Lincoln, void by the resignation of the Reverend Charles Avery Moore.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to extend the Act of the twenty-fourth year of King George the Third, chapter twenty-six, for issuing writs during any recess of the House of Commons, whether by prorogation or adjournment;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, in the manner required by the said Act, that Sir Richard Baggallay, Knt., late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the Middle Division of the county of Surrey, hath accepted the office of a Judge of Her Majesty's Court of Appeal, and has been gazetted thereto in the London Gazette, dated the 29th day of October, 1875, and has thereby vacated his seat; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said Middle Division of the said county, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
