## PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church situate at Scotton in the parish of Worksop in the county of Nottingham, and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Worksop of the parish of Carlton in Lindrick in the said county of Nottingham and in the said diocese of Lincoln, of the parish of Blyth in the same county and diocese and of the parish of Babworth also in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Worksop of the said parish of Carlton in Lindrick of the said parish of Blyth and of the said parish of Babworth should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church situate at Scofton aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of the said

T the Court at Windsor, the 27th day of 11, Carlton House-terrace in the city of Westminster a Member of the Commons House of Parliament and the Right Honourable George Warren Baron de Tabley the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Worksop with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Archbishop of York the patron in right of his see of the rectory of the said parish of Carlton in Lindrick with the consent of the Master Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge, the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Blyth and with the consent of Frances Emily Bridgeman Simpson of Babworth Hall Retford in the said county of Nottingham Widow the patron of the rectoryof the said parish of Babworth (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Worksop, of the said parish of Carlton in Lindrick, of the said parish of Blyth and of the said parish of Babworth which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the man or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church situate at Scofton as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Scofton with Osberton.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Scofton with Osberton, being :-

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish of Worksop of the parish of Carlton in Lindrick, of the parish of Blyth, and of the parish of Babworth all in the county of Nottingham and in the diocese of Lincoln wherein the several incumbents of such parishes now respectively possess the exclusive cure of souls which said portions of such parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the road leading from Blyth diocese of Lincoln with the consent of the Right to Worksop is joined by Thieves Dale-lane and Honourable William Ewart Gladstone, of Number by Forest-lane, at which point the boundary
