EAST RUDHAM FAIRS.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices acting in the Gallow Petty Sessional Division of the county of Norfolk, that Fairs have been annually held on the 17th day of May and on the 14th day of October, respectively, in the parish of East Rudham, in the said Division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should be abolished :

And whereas notice of the said representation,

and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871."

And whereas, on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should be abolished :

And whereas the Marquess of Townshend, as lord or owner of the said Fairs and the tolls thereof, has consented in writing that the said Fairs should be abolished ;

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fairs which have been annually held in the parish of East Rudham, in the Gallow Petty Sessional Division of the county of Norfolk, on the 17th days of May and on the 14th day of October, respectively, shall be abolished as from the date of this order.
