Venice, Jan. 29. The Preparations for the War against the Turks are continued with all poffible diligence; and Commiffions are daily given out for new Levies. A great Convoy is preparing, which will part from hence the next week, with feveral Companies of new raifed Men, and a confiderable Sum of Money, for the Levane. We hear from Dalmatia, That the Troops commanded by the Proveditore-General Cornaro were

gone back to their Quarters. Vimna, Feb. 3. The Turkish Ambaffadors are to have their Audience the 8 inftant. The Minifters of Poland and the Republick have, at the de fire of this Court, lent Expresses to Warfam and Venice, to demand a full Power to Treat and Conclude a Peace, the Inftructions they have now directing them only to hear the Turkish Proposals; and to make Report thereof to their respective Matters. In the mean time we are told, That the Emperor's Demands, belides the Satisfaction of his Allies, are reduced to these Heads; I. That the Port shall for ever quit all Claim and Pretention to Hungary, Croatia, and the Territorics theremoto belonging. II. That Servia, Bolnia, Bugaria, and their Dependencies, Ihall be yelded to the Emperor for ever. III. That the Turks thall not commit any Hostilities against Transplvania, Moldavia, and Valachia, they having put themselves under the Emperor's Protection. IV. That the Port shall not suffer the Tartars within its Dominions. V. That, for the Charges and Damages of the War, the Port Ihall pay fix Millions prefently after the Conclusion of the Peace, and two Millions yearly for ever, VI. That. Teckeley and his Adherents thall be delivered up. The Imperialifts are in pofferfion of Sigerb, the Turkish Garifon being lodged in the lower Town fill Carriages and other Conveniences can be, provilled for the conducting them to the place agreed on in the Capitulations.

Francfort, Febr. 8. The Elector of Bavaria has put Garifons into Bruchsal, Durlach, and fome other finall places in the Neighborhood of Phiapsbourg. The French continue to deflory the country in a molt barbarous manner; They have lately known 18 Bourge and Villages between Vdelberg and the stores. They are demolifying the Fortification of that City and the other places they are going to guit in the Palatinate, from . whence they carry all the Corn they can find to Landato and Strasbeurg.

Hamburgi

Handung, Febr. 11. Although the Plempoany thing more in Writing concerning the differences that have to long depended between the King of Denmark and the Duke their Mafter, yet. they have been fo far perfuaded by the Mediators, that they have declared, That they will, before the end of this Month, give their final Aufwer m Writing. The remaining 2000 Suedes, that are to pais into the Service of the States General of the United Provinces, will be Muffered to morrow, or the day following, in the Dutchy of Bremen; after which they will take their March towards Holland. The Bilhop of Muniter makes new Levies, and we are affured; That he will have 1 5000 Men in his Service before the end of March, The Letters from Warfaw of the 28th pair fay, That the Dyet was drawing towards a Conclusion, and that the principal Matters before them were, the Profecution of the War against the Turks, the continuing the League, and the providing the means necellary for the fame. That the Tartars had made a great Ravage about Polocke and Sniaein, and that some of their Parties had even ad4 vances within a few Miles of Lemberg. The Duke of Hanouer has given Orders to his Troops to be in a readiness to march, against the 10th of the next Month.

Cologne, Febr. 14. The States of the Country of Saurhand have agreed to pay the French 46000 Crowns for the Contributions they demand of They write from Mentz, That the French them. work night and day on the Fortifications of that Place, and those of Caffel on the other fide of the Rhime; That Lieutenant-General Monclar was arrived there from Hydelb rg; and that they were preparing a great mumber of Bombs and Cargaffes for the execution of fome confiderable defign. "We are told from Francfort of the 10th inftant, That the Elector of Broaria, who was on his Return towards Munick, understanding that the French Troops were drawing together on the fiele of the Country of Wirtemberg, was goac back to his Forces. The Elector of Brandenburg has offered to fend hither two Regiments more for the reinforcing our Garison, which it's believed the Magistrates will accept of.

Baffe, Febr. 4. The Dyst of the Suiffe Cantons is Reparated, after having refolved to take the Towns of *Rbinfeld*, *Langtensbourg*, and *Conftance* under their Protection.

Bruffels, Febr. 18. The French have quitted Huy, the Garifon whereof marched towards Timr and Luxemburg; Before their departure they blew up the Walls of the Town: Four hundred Men of the Troops of Liege are now Posted there. The Lotters from Vienna of the 6th inftant inform us, That Pince Loup of Bidan, who had been fent to divers Princes of the Empire, to take Mealures with them in order to a vigorous Profecution of rhe War against France, was returned thither, and had made Report to his Imperial Majelty of the Success of his Commission; That the Count de Thaun was gone to take Posselliou of S.gerb, and give Orders for the fafe conducting of the Garlion to the Turkish Frontiers; And that the Turkish Ambaffadors were to have their Audience the 8th Inftant, the Preliminaries, as well concerning their Reception, as the manner of holding the Conferences afterwards, being finally adjusted. Lordon, Feb. 15. Yesterday Mr. Recorder, with the Sheriffs and Common Serjemit, waited on their Majethes, by Order of the Lond Mayor and Common Coun-

cil, to beg leave for them to strend their Majedies to Congratulate their bappy Acceffion to the Crown. And this day the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons accordingly in a Body waited on their Majeffice in the Banquetting House, and were practiculty received and admitted to kils their Majeffice Hands.
