Orasmuch as it hath pleased God to call Us to the Throne, and that there y it is incumbent upon Us to prevent any Incentregistice to Our Subjects that may wrife by not Executing the Laws necessary or conducing to the Peace and better Government of Our People. We therefore do hereby Declare Our Royal Pleasure to be, That all Persons being Protestants, who upon the Eirst Day of December last past, were in the Offices of Sherifft, Justices of the Peace, Commissioners, Collectors, Receivers, and other Offices and Places concerning the Managing, Collecting, Receiving, and Paying of the Reviewe of this Kingdom, shall be, and shall hold themselves continued in the laid Offices and Places respectively until Our Pleasure be further known. And that they and every of them to take on them the Revention of their said our loving Subjects do give their due Obedience, and be Anding and Assisting unto them therein. the Throne, and that there y it is Incumbent and Allisting unto them therein.

Given at Our Court, at Whitehall, this 14th day of February 1688. In the First Year of Our Reign.

Venice, Jan. 29. The Preparations for the War against the Turks are continued with all poffible diligence; and Commissions are daily given out for new Levies. A great Convoyers preparing, which will part from hence the next week, with feveral Companies of new raifed Men, and a confiderable Sum of Money, for the Lavane. We hear from Dalmatia, That the Troops commanded by the Proveditore-General Cornaro were

gone back to their Quarters.
Vienna, Feb. 3. The Turkish Ambassadors are to have their Audience the 8 inflant. The Ministers of Poland and the Republick have, at the de fire of this Court, fent Expresses to Warfam and Venice, to demand a full Power to Treat and Conclude a Peace, the Instructions they have now directing them only to hear the Turkish Proposals; and to make Report thereof to their respective Masters. In the mean time we are told, That the Emperor's Demands, besides the Satisfaction of his Allies, are reduced to these Heads; I. That the Port shall for ever quit all Clasm and Pretention to Hungary, Croatia, and the Territories thereunto belonging. II. That Servia, Bossia, B. Agarra, and their Dependencies, shall be yelded to the Emperor for ever. III. That the Turks thall not commit any Hostilities, against Transplvania, Moldavia, and Valachia, they having put themselves under the Emperor's Protection. IV. That the Port shall not suffer the Tartars within its Dominions. V. That, for the Charges and Damages of the War, the Port Thall pay fix Millions presently after the Conclusion of the Peace, and two Millions yearly for every VI. That. Teckeley and his Adherents thall be delivered up. The Imperialifts are in possession of Sigest, the Turkish Garison being lodged in the lower Town fill Carriages and other Conveniences can be provilled for the conducting them to the place agreed on in the Capitulations.

Francfore, Febr. 8. The Elector of Bavaria has put Garifons into Bruchsal, Durlach, and forne other small places in the Neighborhood of Phi-Apstoners. The French continue to destroy the Country in a most barbarous manner; They have letely knint. 18 burgs and Villages between Hydelbers and the Kore. They are demolishing the Fortifications of that City and the other places they are going to quit in the Palatinate, from whence they carry all the Corn they can find to Landare and Strasbourg.
