THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, reporting that a Circular has been addressed by the Spanish Director-General of Customs to the Superintendents of Custom-houses, stating that acetate of morphine, being an organic salt used exclusively for medicinal purposes, will henceforth pay the duty prescribed by section 94 of the Customs' Tariff, viz. :—20 per cent. ad valorem.
