A DESPATCH, of which the following is a copy, has been received by the Secretary of State for War:—

*Head Quarters, Camp at Kinta,
(on Kinta River), December 18, 1875.*

SIR,
I HAVE the honour to acquaint you that by the exertions of the Civil Commissioner in procuring native water transport, &c., of Captain Buller, R.N., Commanding Her Majesty's ship "Modeste," Senior Naval Officer, in causing the adaption of boats to the service, and a sufficient amount of stores having been provided by the Control Department, the Force (Naval and Military), as per margin*, was enabled to advance from the above place up the river towards Blanja, on the 8th instant.

The labour in poling the heavily laden boats against the strong current was so severe, and the delay caused by the grounding of some of the larger boats, and the intricacy of the channel so frequent, that it was scarcely possible or advisable to attempt more than seven or eight miles advance each day. The troops encamped on successive nights on an island above Passir Sala, at Passir Garnam, at Pulo Telor (a short distance above Lumbha), and at two miles beyond Bhota, arriving at Blanja on the 13th instant, without having experienced any opposition on the river; the villages, however, were mostly deserted and the boats removed.

Receiving intelligence at Blanja that the Malay Chiefs, Lela and Ismael (supposed to be implicated in the murder of the Resident) had passed through Blanja and taken the road to Kinta, and that it was their intention to obstruct the passage of this road, I decided, with the concurrence of the Senior Naval Officer, and the Civil Commissioner, to commence an advance without delay from the Perak River, through the jungle to the Kinta River, and get possession of the Kinta capital. I accordingly proceeded with the force as before (leaving 50 men, 1st Battalion, 10th Regiment, under an officer to occupy Blanja). The extreme badness of the narrow path, through the intensely thick jungle, constantly interrupted by trees of very large size fallen across it, the swampy ground and deep mud over which it was necessary to pass, and occasionally to construct a rough cord-ray way for the guns, rendered progress very slow.

At a turn in the path, about two or three miles from Blanja, the first opposition was encountered; a rapid fire was opened upon the advanced guard, which was under command of Lieutenant Paton, 1st Battalion, 10th Regiment, from behind a stockade, concealed by the thickness of the jungle, at about 30 yards' distance. Our men placed themselves under cover and returned the fire with promptitude. One of the guns, Royal Artillery, and the naval rocket tube, were brought forward, and the enemy retreated hastily. No casualty on our side occurred with the exception of a severe wound through the thigh received by Dr. Randall, the Colonial Medical Officer, who accompanied the expedition. It was impossible to ascertain the numbers of the opposing Malays, or the amount of loss inflicted on them.

After a further advance of about two miles fire was again opened from another stockade on rising ground on our front, which was taken possession of in the same manner as the former. This was a well-chosen position, and I feel confident from the character of the work here commenced, and the extensive preparations that had been made for its completion, that it was intended to make an obstinate stand at this point, and that had this and others at favourable points been completed their capture would have been attended with some difficulty and probable loss. The jungle on both sides is for the most part impenetrable for troops, and the use of flanking parties impossible, and it is most difficult to obtain a view of the enemy interrupting the march.

The force halted at the close of the day (at dusk) on a comparatively open piece of ground on the side of a ravine, at the bottom of which there was a stream of water. Here also stockading had commenced. The labour of the men, particularly of the Royal Artillery and rocket men, had been so severe that Captain Buller and myself concurred in the expediency of resting here on the following day, a sufficient defence being thrown up to protect the force from surprise. On the following morning (the 15th) the troops and Naval Brigade again advanced, and reached the Papan Mines without impediment, except from the badness of the road, about six miles from Kinta, encamping there, and remaining the following day to allow time for the arrival of further supplies from the rear, which had been much delayed.

From this place a reconnoitring party of about 40 men, under a friendly Rajah (Mahmoud) was sent, accompanied by Mr. Swettenham, one of the Civil Commissioners, whose local knowledge and

thorough acquaintance with Malay has been of the greatest use.

This party halted at some open ground about two miles from Kinta. The main body advanced on the following morning, the 17th, and arrived at this spot at about 12 mid-day (the road being equally bad or worse than on the former days). The enemy were found in occupation of a stockade some short distance in advance, and after some firing were dislodged.

The force proceeded to Kinta, which was taken after a slight resistance, the enemy abandoning the town and defences, and retreating up the river in their boats.

Nine (9) bronze guns of small calibre were left by them,—some thrown into the river. There is no doubt the ex-Sultan Ismael had preceded us at a short interval, and from information received that it was intended strongly to obstruct the road from Blanja. There were evident signs of a hasty retreat, which I regret the smallness of the force, the situation of the town on the opposite bank of the river, and its great length and the character of the country, prevented our effectually interrupting. I am convinced that it has been of great importance to secure this road before the hostile Malays had time to obstruct the passage through this dangerous jungle more effectually than they did, and I am assured by the Commissioners that the moral effect of the occupation of Kinta will be very beneficial. The Rajah Lela, with the ex-Sultan Ismael, are supposed to have fled together into the Patani, or Lower Siam territory. It is my intention to remain here until receiving further instructions from His Excellency the Governor.

I imagine it will be considered necessary to occupy this part of the country with a military force until matters are settled, and the murderers of the Resident are given up, or satisfaction obtained.

I expect shortly the arrival of a portion of the 3rd Regiment (Buffs), and a part of the Goorkha Force from Qualla Quansa.

The troops proceeded on the march without tents, carrying their waterproof sheets and blankets, but their white clothing is very ill adapted to the present service.

I am happy, however, to state that, notwithstanding the exposure, the occasional heavy rains, and change of temperature at night, the health of the men has been good, and they are now comfortably housed in this town.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic, c. 17).

WHEREAS by Section 68 of the above-named Act, it is provided as follows:—

(No. 8.)—SPAIN, WEST COAST—BUOYAGE OF VIGO BAY.

INFORMATION has been received through Rear-Admiral F. Beauchamp P. Seymour, C.B., commanding the Channel Squadron, that the positions of new iron buoys marking the prominent dangers in Vigo Bay have been ascertained by Staff Commander H. D. Sarrat to be as follows:—

1. *Castros de Barra*.—A nun buoy, painted red and black in vertical stripes, with staff and cage, marked *Castros*, is moored in 9 fathoms, off the south part of the shoal, with the following marks and bearings: viz.—

Subrido Point in line with Point Caballo, N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

Faro Lighthouse, West southerly.

2. *Borneira*.—A nun buoy, painted red and white in vertical stripes, marked *Borneira*, in 6 fathoms, off the south part of Bajo Borneira.

Faro Lighthouse, W. $\frac{2}{3}$ N.

Subrido Point, N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

At a distance of one cable north of the buoy, there is 3 fathoms.

3. *Zalgueiron*.—A can buoy, painted red with a white top, in 7 fathoms, close to the south-eastward of Zalgueiron Rock.

Cangas Church, N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Faro Lighthouse, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

4. *Rodeira*.—A can buoy, painted black and white in horizontal stripes, with staff and cage, marked *Rodeira*, in $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, off the south part of the shoal.

Faro Lighthouse, W. $\frac{2}{3}$ N.

5. *Toralla*.—A red nun buoy, with staff and cage, marked *Bondania*, in 7 fathoms off Toralla Islet.

6. *Cabo de Mar*.—A red can buoy, with staff and cage, off Cabo de Mar, in $7\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms.

7. *Bouzas*.—A can buoy, red and white in vertical stripes, with a red band round the top, marked *Bouzas*, in 5 fathoms, off the shoal El Cabezon.

Mount Alba, S. $\frac{2}{3}$ W.

NOTE.—The beacon on Piedra de Pago is bent and not seen at half tide, but the rock, being only 3 cables from the shore, with 7 fathoms one and a half cables south of it, may be easily avoided with care.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 9.)—CENTRAL AMERICA—WEST COAST—PORT REALEJO.

Fixed Light on Cardon Island.

INFORMATION has been received that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse on Cardon Head, the north-east point of Cardon Island, Port Realejo.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 64 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 13 miles.

The lighthouse, 33 feet high, is built of wood, octagonal in shape, and painted white. Position as given, lat. 12° 27' 55" N., long. 87° 7' 47" W.

NOTE.—The centre of Cardon Channel, which is the proper entrance into Port Realejo, is about half a cable northward of the lighthouse, and is navigable for large vessels. The false entrance, southward of Cardon Island, is navigable for boats only.

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Neath and District Tramways Company Limited, under the powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act, 1870 :—

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from

a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or willfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in the interior of any carriage shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage or travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in

or on any such carriage, when warned by the conductor not to do so.

16. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter, or mount, or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

18. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive, or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage, in breach of this regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

20. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded firearms.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

22. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

23. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

24. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company, and having charge of a carriage.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

26. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1876.
