Venice, Jan. 30.

HE Troops of Brunswick and Hesse Darmstadt, who are returned from the Morea, having performed their Quarantain, will in few days, begin their march towards Germany; The Term for which they were engaged in the Service of this Republick being expired: And the Princes of Brunfwick and Darmstadt, under whose Command they are, will follow them so soon as the Carneval is over. The Senate continues to give out Commissions for new Levies. And Seyeral Merchant Ships, that lately arrived here, are taken into the Service of the State, for the Transporting Men, Ammunition, Provisions, to the Levant. We hear from Dalmatia, that General Cornaro was preparing for foine new deligits which he would put in Execution fo foon as his Troops had refreshed themselves in the marters into which he had lately put them.

Vienna, Febr. 6. The Turkish Ambassadors are to have their Audience on Tuefday next; And the day following the Imperial Ministers, with those of the Allies, will enter into Conference with them. The Lieutenant-General Count de Thaun is gone to Sigeth, with the Vice-Baffa of that place; The Garison confifts of 600 Men, who are to remain dif-armed in the Lower Town, as well till the Rivers be open, for the more convenient pasfage of themselves and their Boggage, as till the Persons the Bassa of Sigeth hath promised to fend to Canisa, to acquaint that Garison with the present State of Assairs in the Ortoman Empire, and to perfuade them to provide for their own Safery, by an Honorable Capitulation, which they may now obtain, have performed that Commission. parialifts found in Signal 85 pieces of Cannon, with a great quantity of Ammunition. The Emperor has sent a Declaration to Rarabome, forbidding all the Members of the Empire a Neutrality with France, and declaring such, as shall enter into any Engagements for that purpole, Enemies of the Empire. We have advice from Poland, that an Envoy was arrived at Reufblemberg from the Cham of Turtary, to perfuade the Poles to make a Peace with the Port: And that the Cham was himfelf, with s numerous Army, in Beserabia.

Liege, Febr. 10. Our Cittadel is demolished; And the French have quirted Hus, (after having blown up the Walls,) and the other places they were possessed of in this B. ocefs, except Chiney, where they pretend to keep a Garilon, till the Durch do likewise abandon the Caltle of Oppay; Of which Notice has been given to the Governor of Maestricht.

Norwich, Febr. 16. This day the High Sheriff of the County of Norfolk, with divers Deputy-Lieutenants and Gentlemen, accompanied the Mayor and Aldermen, and Chief of the Citizens, at the Proclaiming of KING WILLIAM and QUEEN MARY, (pursuant to a Letter from the Lords of His Majesties Most Honorable Privy Council,) which was performed in feveral parts of this City, with great Solemnity and Cheerful Acclamations of valt Throngs of People; after which the High Sheriff gave a handsome Entertainment, and the day was concluded with firing the great Guns, Ringing of Bells, and Bonfires: And the High Sheriff has taken Care to have their Majesties Proclaimed in all Market Towns in the County.

Chefter, Febr. 18. Yesterday in the afternoon the KING and QUEEN were Proclaimed with the greatest Joy and Solemnity that ever was feen here, two Heralds in their Habits read the Proclamation to the Sheriffs, the Mayor and Aldermen being in their Scarlet, and the Common-Council, and the rest of the Corporation, in their Fornalities all on Horfeback, accompanied with averal of my Lord Delamers Officers, and divers Gentlemen on Horfeback, all the Companies attending with their Flage and Streamers; the Proclamation was read in feven places, and the great Guns were as often fired, with several Vollies of small thot, and a splendid Enterfairment was made for all perform at the Publick Charge of the City in the Pentice or Guildhall; and Bonfires, and ringing of Bells, with many Joyful Acclamations concluded the night.
Wrombe, Febr. 16. This day the KING and

QUEEN were Proclaimed with great Solemnity in this Town; The Mayor and Aldernien attending in their Formallties, Celebrated the Ceremony with all imaginable Joy, and foud Accismations of the People, the Night concluded with Drinking Their Majellies Healths, Ringing of Balls and Bonfires.
