NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 14.)—ADRIATIC—ISTRIA—CAPE PROMONTORE.

(1.) *Fixed Light on Porer Rock.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 135, dated 23rd September, 1875, on the exhibition of a provisional light during the alteration of the light apparatus on Porer Rock, Cape Promontore:—

The Austrian Government has given further notice, that the permanent light is now exhibited from the lighthouse.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 111 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 16 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The provisional light has been discontinued.

TRIESTE BAY.

(2.) *Harbour Light at Port Pirano.*

Also, that a *fixed green* light is now exhibited from a lantern at the head of the new mole at Port Pirano. It is elevated 22 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of two miles.
