

## The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Monmouthshire, holden at Newport. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against James Richards Reed, of No. 57, Raglan-street, in the borough of Newport, in the county of Monmouth, Master Mariner.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the act of Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said James Richards Reed having been given, it is ordered that the said James Richards Reed be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 1st day of February, 1876.
