In the mean time we are not a little allarmed with the newsbrought hither by an Express from the Crown General; That the Tartars, to the number of above 60000 Mereon the Tarture, to the number of above 60000 Mengans, der the Command of Sultan Naradini, and three other Sultans, Sons of the Chain of Tartury, had passed the Neister, and were advancing towards the Frontiers of this Kingdom, taking the opportunity of the Frost, which gives them a liberty of passing the Rivers and Marshes.
