

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board. Altering Name of Local Board :—

Dudley Union.

Local Government District of Lower Sedgley.
To the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Lower Sedgley, in the county of Stafford ;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 311 of the Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted as follows :—

“ Any Local Board constituted either before or after the passing of this Act may, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, change their name. Every such change of name shall be published in such manner as the Local Government Board may direct ;”

And whereas the Local Board for the District of Lower Sedgley, in the county of Stafford, at a Meeting held after due notice on the 7th day of September, 1875, resolved that the name of the said Board should be altered from Lower Sedgley Local Board to Coseley Local Board ; and application has been made by them to the Local Government Board to sanction such change of name :

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the several Statutes in that behalf, hereby give our sanction to the name of the said Local Board being changed to “ The Coseley Local Board.”

And we hereby direct that the said Local Board shall cause this instrument to be published two successive weeks in some newspaper circulating within their District, within one month from the date hereof.

The present light on Morro Fort is the only light at the entrance of Port San Juan.
