REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations

shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board: Proceedings under Bastardy Acts. Vaccination: Regulations.

Parish of Barrow-in-Furness.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the parish of Barrow-in-Furness, in the county of Lancaster;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order bearing date the 6th day of March, 1876, the Local Government Board ordered that the laws for the relief of the Poor in the parish of Barrow-in-Furness should, on and after the 19th day of April, 1876, be administered by a Board of Guardians;

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of certain General Orders hereinafter mentioned should be made applicable to the said parish of Barrow-in-Furness:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows; that is to say,—

On and after the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the provisions of the Orders hereafter recited shall be applicable to the parish of Barrow-in-Furness, and shall be binding upon the Guardians of that parish, and their officers; namely,—

1. The General Order of the Poor Law Board, dated the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, prescribing the form of contract to be entered into for Public Vaccination.

2. The General Order of the Local Government Board, dated the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, prescribing

the forms of the notices of requirement of Vaccination to be given by Registrars of Births, and the forms of certificates relating to vaccination to be given by Public Vaccinators and Medical Practitioners.

3. The General Order of the Local Government Board, dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, prescribing regulations with respect to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Boards of Guardians, the tenure of office, duties, and remuneration of such officers, and the institution and conduct of the proceedings under the Vaccination Acts, and the costs incurred in such proceedings.

4. The General Order of the Local Government Board, dated the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, prescribing forms of proceedings in bastardy, upon the application of Guardians of the Poor.
