- REGULATIONS made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners for carrying into effect "The Public Works Loans Act, 1875."
- 1. All words used in these Regulations shall have the same meaning as is assigned to them by "The Public Works Loans Act, 1875," which Act is hereinafter referred to as "The Act."

2. The Loan Commissioners shall elect a Chairman and Deputy Chairman, and three Commis-

sioners shall form a quorum.

3. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present, the Deputy Chairman shall be the Chairman of the meeting, and if neither the Chairman nor Deputy Chairman be present, then the Commissioners present shall choose one of their number to be the Chairman of such meeting.

4. Meetings of the Commissioners shall be held as often as the business to be transacted may be found to require, and shall be convened by notice

from the Secretary.

5. All questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second

or casting vote.

6. A book to be called the minute book shall be kept, in which applications for loans and minutes of the proceedings and resolutions of the Commissioners shall be recorded, and such other books shall be kept as the Commissioners may think necessary.

7. The fees or sums to be paid by the applicants in respect of Loans on rates, pursuant to section 41, shall not exceed the following sums,
