Whitehall, March 5.

THIS Afternoon the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes in Parliament Affembled, prefented to His Majefly, in the Banquetting-House, the following Address.

Loyal Subjects, the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes in Parliament Affembled, have taken into our Seri-

ous Confideration Your Majestics Gracious Massage, wherein Your Majesty is pleased to express Your great Goodness, and Sense of Your Peoples Condition, by Your tender Confideration, That the Revenue of the Hearth-Money is very grievous to them, and are pleased to agree either to the Regulation of it, or to the taking of it wholly away; And as Your Ma-jefty is pleased in this to confider the Ease of Your People, We acknowledge our felves oblig'd to Declare, That Your Majesty has fill d our Hearts with an intire Satufaction and Gratitude, by this Your most Gracious and Unpresidented Offer. And We bumbly crave Leave to prefent this Affurance to Tour Majesty, That we will make such grateful and affectionate Returns, and be fo careful of the fupport of the Crown, that the World may fee, to the discouraging of Your Enemies, and fainfaction of all good Men, That Your Majesties Reigns in the Hearts of Your People. Which God grant long to continue.

Venice, Febr. 12. The Convoy commanded by Signior Thadeo Gradenige fet fail on Saturday laftfor the Morea ; and another great Convoy is preparing, which will be ready in a very fhort time. A great many Veffels are hired, to transport as well the new raifed Troops that are now at the Lido, as the 4000 Men that are to be fent from Dalmatia, for the reinforcing our Army in the Morea. The Troops of Brunfwicke, which are come back from the Levant, will begin their march the next week towards Germany; but, it's believed, the Prince of Brunswicke, who commanded them, will return to the Morea, to pass the next Campagne in the Army of this State. It is confirmed by feveral Perfons come from the Levant, that the Captain Baffa was arrived at Negrepone with the Soldlers that had ferved the laft year on their Men of War, which are now laid inp; and had affured the Garilon, that greater Suc-cors would be very interding that great suc-cors would be very interding tent thither; that in the mean time they worked with great diligence to re-pair the Fortifications that were rulined during the Siege, and to make feveral new Intrenchiments within the nime. The Senate have made choice of Signior (Malanna Veniers late Arthaffator from this Result Stolamo Venieri late Ambaffator from this Republick in France, to go in the fame Quality to the Court at Vienna.

The Sieur P(z, m, s, y), who is returned from his Embally in Mo/c vv, has made Report in the Diet of the fuccels of his N.g. tiation; and it is refulved to fend another Minifter. thither. An Envoy is arrived here from the Cham of Tartary, who had Audience of the King the 31 th paft ; He comes to propole a Peace between this Crown and the Furks, declaring, That the Kam, whom he left with the Seraskier at Killey, did expect a politive Answer, which if he did not receive within 20 days from the time of the faid Envoys arrived here, he would fend his Troops to ravage all the Fightier Provinces of this Kingdom. The Anfwer that has been given him is, That the King will not enter upon any Treaty without the Communication and Confent of his Allies; and, that a Negotiation being already fet on foot by the Furkish Envoys at Vienna, they ought to expect the fuccels thereof. They write from Bialacerkien, That the Molcovites and Coffacks are drawing together in great numbers, with defign to make an Incurfion into the Crim Tartary,

Stockholme; Febr. 2. "The King is now on his return from Schonen, where he has taken a review of his Forcet, making together 25000 Men; great part whereof will, it's believed, be transported in the Spring to Germany. The Heer Guldenlieu is arrived here in the Quality of Ambaffador Extraorelinary from the King of Denmark. Preparations are making for the meeting of the States of this Kingdom.

Vienna, Febr. 20. The Conferences are continued with the Turkish Envoys with those Dispositions to an Agreement, that in all appearance a Peace will be fpeedily concluded. We have Advice, that the Garilon of Canifa have, upon the News of the furrender of Sizeth, refolved to give up that Place upon the fame Conditions. The laft Letters from Belgrade laid, that the Turks did Affemble about Sophia, and that the Count d: Hofkirken was abroad with a firong Detachement to observe them; having, for his fecurity against a furprize, possessed himself of feveral advantageous Posts towards Niffa. We have an Account, that the Prince and States of Tranfilvania have not only promifed to furnish the Imperial Troops quartered there, with Provisions, but have likewife refolved, that the Militia of that Country faall join with them for their defence against the Invalion of the Turks and Tartars. Orders are fent to five Regiments of German Horfe now in Hungary; and to the Troops railed by the Baron de Heufler; and the Counts de Palfi; and Czóber; to march with all the diligence they can towards Germany.

Finitfort, Fibr. 24. The French continue to work with entraordinary, diligence on the Fortifications of Mayene and Caffel and the Bridge they are laying there over the Rhine, which is almost minued. They have this week burnt 11 Villages in the Neighborhood of Hyd-lberg; and have made a Lor of above 150 Bourga and Villages which they intend to deftroy on both fides the Rhine. They have, as we are affured, refolved to abandon all the Places they are polleit of on the East-lide of the Rhine, except Plalipsbourg : The French Garifon in Dilsberg has been forced to furrender to the Saxons on Differention.

Francfore, Febr. 27. The French Troops, as those of the Empire advance towards the Rhine, are forced to quit the Places they had poffelled themfelves of, and to repais that River ; leaving nothing but mifery and ruine behind them. A Detachement of the Troops of Saxony is entred into Benfbeim, a finall Town in the Bergstraft; they have likewife put Garifons into Ulmstadt, Darmstadt, and Eppenheim, to fecure the Country on that lide against the Enemies Incursions. The French Galifon at Menty continues to work, with the afflifance of the Country People, on the Fortifi-cations of that Place, and on those of Caffel on the other fide of the Rhise, and to build a Fort in the Ifland which commands there the two Branches of that River. A General Officer of the Imperial Forces palled through this place two days ago, in his way to Coblentz, where he is to command in chief.

Berlin, Febr. 12. The Levies that are making for the lervice of our Elector, advance very fuccess-fully; and, it's faid, his Electoral Highness has refolved, to foon as those are compleated, to give out Committions for the railing 5 or 6000 Men more. There is a Difcourfe, that the Elector of Saxony will be here very fuddenly to Confer with his Electotal Highness of Brandenburg concerning the present

rai ruginiers or pranaenourg concerning the present Juncture of Affairs, Cologne, Febr. 28. The Troops of Brandenburg have put Garidons into Recklinghaufen, Dorften, and Alpen, by iwhich means they pretend to cover the Country of Cleves from the Enemies Incursions; A Detachement of Bran-denburgers, who were abroad about Duidgerg, meeting, this week with a Party of Horke of the Cardinal of Fuefferburger's Troobs, they took 26. and carried them Furstemberg's Troops, they took 36, and catried them Prifoners to Duysbourg.

Parn, March 9. The Duke of Duras will part from hence in few days for Germany, being to Command the French Army on the Rhine. The Troops of the Kings Houshold are to Encamp the isth of the next Month near Verfailles. There has been a report in Fown fince yellerday, that the French have quitted Hydelberg ; and that they had begun to difmantle Frankendall. The laft Letters from Rome give an account of the Death of Cardinal Pio Protector of the Affairs of Germany ; and, that the Pope had given out divers Commissions for new Levies.
