Whitehall, March 5. HIS Afternoon the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses in Parliament Assembled, pre-

sented to His Majesty, in the Banquetting-House, the following Address.

TE Your Majosties most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses in Parliament Affembled, have taken into our Serious Consideration Your Majesties Gracious M. Sage, wherein Your Majesty is pleased to express Your great Goodness, and Sense of Your Peoples Condition, by Your tender Consideration, That the Revenue of the Hearth-Money is very grievous to them, and are pleased to agree either to the Regulation of it, or to the taking of it wholly away; And as Your Ma-jesty is pleased in this to consider the Ease of Your People, We acknowledge our selves oblig'd to Declare, That Your Majesty has fill'd our Heares with an intire Satufaction and Gratitude, by this Your most Gracious and Unpresidented Offer. And We humbly crave Leave to present this Assurance to Your Majesty, That we will make such grateful and affectionate Returns, and be so careful of the support of the Crown, that the World may fee, to the discouraging of Your Enemies, and Sainfaction of all good Men, That Your Majesties Reigns in the Hearts of Your People. Which God grant long to continue.

Venice, Febr. 12. The Convoy commanded by Signior Thadeo Gradenigo fet fail on Saturday laftfor the Morea; and another great Convoy is preparing, which will be ready in a very short time. A great many Vessels are hired, to transport as well the new raised Troops that are now at the Lido, as the 4000 Men that are to be sent from Dalmatia, for the reinforcing our Army in the Morea. The Troops of Brunswicke, which are come back from the Levant, will begin their march the next week towards Germany; but, it's believed, the Prince of Brunswicke, who commanded them, will return to the Morea, to pass the next Campagne in the Army of this State. It is confirmed by feveral Persons come from the Levant, that the Captain Baffa was airived at Negrepone with the Soldlers that had ferved the last year on their Men of War, which are now laid in ; and had affured the Garilon, that greater Succors would be very fixedly fent thither; that in the mean time they worked with great diligence to repair the Fortification that were ruined during the Siege, and to make feveral new Intrenchments within the name. The Senate have made choice of Signior Carolamo Veniers late Amhassator from this Republication veniers late Amhassator from this Repub Cholamo Venier, late Amballator from this Republick in France, to go in the fame Quality to the Court at Vienna.

Warfate, Febr. 4. The Diet proceeds very flowly in their Deliberations. Some of the Deputies have propoted, That the Effate of the Princels Radgiville,

Wife of Prince Charles of Neubourg, fhould be Confiscated, and given to Prince James, eldest Son of the King of Po'and'; but as yet no resolution has been taken in this Matter. The Sieur P. J. emesoy, who is returned from his Embatfy in Molecus, has made Report in the Diet of the success of his N. g. tiation; and it is refolved to fend another Ministes. thither. An Envoy is arrived here from the Cham of Tartary, who had Audience of the King the 31 th past; He comes to propose a Peace between this Crown and the Furks, declaring, That the Kam, whom he left with the Séraskier at Kiliey, did expect a politive Answer, which if he did not receive within 20 days from the time of the faid Envoys arrival here, he would fend his Troops to ravage all the Frontier Provinces of this Kingdom. The Answer that has been given him is, That the King will not enter upon any Treaty without the Communication and Consent of his Allies; and, that a Negotiation being already fet on foot by the Furkish Engoys at Vienna, they ought to expect the success thereof. They write from Bialacerkiem, That the Mojcovites and Coffacks are drawing together in great numbers, with defign to make an Incursion into the Crim

Stockholme, Febr. 2. Pile hing is now on his return from Schonen, where he has taken a review of his Forcel, making together 25000 Men; great part whereof will, it's believed, be transported in the Spring to Germany. Vienna, Febr. 20. The Conferences are continued with the Turkish Envoys with those Dispositions to an Agreement, that in all appearance a Peace will be speedily concluded. We have Advice, that the Garison of Canifa have, upon the News of the furrender of Sizeth, resolved to give up that Place upon the fame Conditions. The last Letters from Belgrade faid, that the Turks did Affemble about Sophia, and that the Count d: Hofkirken was abroad with a firong Detachement to observe them, having, for his lecurity against a surprize, possessed similar of several advantageous Posts towards Nissa. We have an Account, that the Prince and States of Transilvania have not only promifed to furnish the Imperial Troops quartered there, with Provisions, but have likewife resolved, that the Militia of that Country shall join with them for their defence against the Invalion of the Turks and Tartars. Orders are sent to five Regiments of German Horse now in Hungary; and to the Troops railed by the Baron de Houster; and the Counts de Palfi; and Czober; to march with all the diligence they can towards
