

"niently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes. And the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council, to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect. And such Order being registered in the registry of the diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, including the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas Archibald Campbell, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury hath, in pursuance of the 26th section of the hereinbefore said Act, made a report to Her Majesty in Council, in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"The undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury doth in pursuance of the twenty-sixth Section of the Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That there is in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury the benefice (being a rectory) of Chelsfield the parish of which comprises amongst other places the chapelry of Farnborough the limits and boundaries of which chapelry are well known and defined and the said chapelry except for ecclesiastical purposes is wholly distinct and separate from the said parish of Chelsfield.

"That the population of the parish of Chelsfield exclusive of the said chapelry amounts to nine hundred and three and the population of the said chapelry amounts to one thousand and eighty-six.

"That the said chapelry of Farnborough contains a church or chapel which affords sufficient accommodation for the inhabitants of the said chapelry.

"That there is a house of residence belonging to Chelsfield but none to Farnborough.

"That the distance between the parish church of Chelsfield and the church of the said chapelry of Farnborough is three miles or thereabouts.

"That the gross annual value of the benefice of Chelsfield inclusive of the chapelry of Farnborough is one thousand two hundred and eighty pounds or thereabouts arising as follows—

"That the patronage of the rectory and parish church of Chelsfield belongs to the warden and College of the Souls of All Faithful People deceased of Oxford and the present rector of the rectory is the Reverend Folliott Baugh. The said Warden and College and the said rector consent to the separation hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the session held in the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 and of the second and third years of your Majesty's reign chapter 49 the said chapelry of Farnborough may be advantageously separated from the parish and parish church of Chelsfield and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with such scheme he doth by this report to your Majesty in Council certify the same to your Majesty together with the consents in writing to the said scheme of the Patrons and Incumbent of the said benefice to the intent that your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

And whereas the aforesaid scheme and consent mentioned in the said report are in the words and figures following:—

"The Scheme referred to in the foregoing Report.

"The said chapelry of Farnborough shall be separated from the said parish and parish church of Chelsfield and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the style of the perpetual curacy of Farnborough of which the church or chapel within the said chapelry shall be the parish church.

"Such separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said parish of Chelsfield and the Incumbent of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"All the tithe rent charges belonging to the said rectory of Chelsfield which arise and accrue or are payable within or in respect of the said chapelry of Farnborough shall belong and be attached to the said proposed benefice of Farnborough and be held and enjoyed by the Incumbent thereof for the time being for ever but no other change shall be made in the endowments of the said rectory.

"All ecclesiastical offices shall be performed in the church of the said proposed parish and benefice of Farnborough. All the fees and payments for such offices and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a parish or benefice
