

## The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Wiltshire, holden at Swindon. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against John Longford, of Cirencester, in the county of Gloucester Tailor.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the acts of the Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said John Longford, having been given, it is ordered that the said John Longford, he, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 24th day of July, 1876.
