Alteration in Hægholm Light.

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that from the 15th July, 1876, the following alteration would be made in Hægholm Light, western side of Christiania Harbour.

The light would be exhibited from a new lighthouse, and visible between the bearings of E.N.E., through east and south, to W. 3 S.; the first named bearing leads to the northward of Rambergskaar and the shallows, which lie about one and a half cables to the westward of the lighthouse; the bearing W. 3 S. leads to the northward of Blego. The light is elevated 20 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 6 miles.

The lighthouse is painted yellow.
