the said Arthur Charles or other the then Bishop of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells and his successors in the same Bishoprick and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Charles or other the then Bishop of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells and by his successors Bishops of that diocese for ever But so nevertheless as that the turn or right of presentation to the said vicarage or incumbency of the said benefice of Paulton which shall arise in respect of the vacancy in the same benefice happening first after the day of the date of such publication as aforesaid shall be exercised by the then vicar of Chewton Mendip and that the second turn or right of presentation to the same vicarage or incumbency and every alternate turn or right thereafter shall be exercised by the Bishop of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells for the time

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act

of Parliament,"

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forth-with registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have ers for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-four; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; and of the Act of the thirtyfirst and thirty-second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and sixty, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventysix, in the words and figures following, that is

to say, "We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirtyseven; of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-

cessors in the same vicarage or incumbency to I four; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four; and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and sixty, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Saint Jude, Gray's Inn-road, and out of the parish of Saint Poter, Regent-square both within the original limits of the parish of Saint Pancras in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, and for effecting an apportionment of the income of the rectory of Saint Peter le Poer with the perpetual curacy of Saint Benet Fink annexed in the city of London and in the said diocese of London.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Saint Jude, Gray's Inn-road, and of the said parish of Saint Peter, Regent-square which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner herein-

after recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district so to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Jude Gray's Inn-road and Saint Peter, Regent-square as aforesaid any consecrated church or chapel in

use for the purposes of Divine worship.
"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Saint Pancras have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act to the incumbent of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted as soon as one shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors, a grant of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum and also so soon as a church shall have been erected within and for such district and shall have been approved by us and shall have been consecrated as the church of such district, and such district shall have thereupon become a new parish within the meaning of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act to make to the incumbent of the said new parish and his successors a further grant from the said fund of fifty pounds per annum.

"And whereas such grants as aforesaid will be made by an instrument or instruments to be executed by us under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty

"And whereas the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Saint Paul in London are the patrons of the said rectory of Saint Peter-le-Poer with the perpetual curacy of Saint Benet Fink annexed, the endowments of which said rectory and perpetual curacy are of considerable amount and comprise certain annual sums of money payable in lieu of tithes which amount together to one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five pounds per annum or thereabouts.
