THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, enclosing the following Royal Order:—

(Translation.)

Modification of the Spanish Tariff of Consular Fees.

Form in which Modified.

1. The fees for the provisional transfer (to the national flag) of foreign ships, and for the sale of Spanish ships established under Articles 41 and 42

of the Tariffs, are reduced in each case to $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the value of the ships, instead of 1 per cent., as charged at present.

2. The dues to which these four articles refer are definitively suppressed.

3. In substitution of the same, it is ordered that, for the examination of the invoices presented by shippers for the purpose of being comprised in the manifests which captains are required to present in the administrations of Customs, at their destinations there, shall be paid 20 or 50 centimos (cents) of a peseta for each ton of 1,000 kilogrammes, or fraction of a ton, declared in accordance with the rules defined for other duties in the Tariff.

In order to verify the exactitude of the said invoices the Consul will demand of the captains a copy of the bill of lading corresponding to each invoice.

4. An equal duty will be levied on merchandise imported by land, and which must be specified in the bills of the sender of such merchandise.

5. The duty established for the states of Europe, and for those of Africa and Asia, on the coasts of the Mediterranean and of the Black Sea will be extended to those parts of Africa situated on the Atlantic as far as the frontier of the foreign colony established in Senegambia.

6. In order that these changes may come into operation at the same date so as to avoid any kind of complaint, the 15th day of November next is designated for their fulfilment in all the Consular Chancelleries of Spain abroad.

Batley Corporation Water.

Revival of Powers and Extension of Time for Compulsory Purchase of Land for Authorised Works ; Alteration of Water Rates and Rents, and Imposition of New Rates ; Alteration and Increase of Borrowing Powers ; New Provisions as to Sinking Fund ; Capitalization of Interest on Money borrowed for Works whilst same are unproductive ; Application of Purchase Money for the Share and Interest of the Corporation in the Dewsbury, Batley, and Heckmondwike Waterworks ; Confirmation of Purchase by the Corporation of Brownhill Mills, and Power to Sell same and Apply Purchase Money ; Amendment and Repeal of Acts.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Batley, in the West Riding of the county of York, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the district of the said borough (hereinafter referred to as the Corporation), intend to apply to Parliament in the next session thereof, for an Act for all or any of the following purposes (that is to say) :—

(1.) To revive the powers conferred by the Batley Corporation Waterworks Act, 1871, and to extend the time for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes authorised by that Act.

(2.) To vary, alter, and impose new and increased water, and other rates, rents, duties, and charges for water supplied, or to be supplied, in bulk, by meter, or otherwise ; and, for effecting such objects, to alter, amend, and, if necessary, repeal sections 58 and 59 of the Batley Corporation Waterworks Act, 1871, and some of the provisions of the Acts incorporated therewith, or recited therein, or of any other Act in anywise relating to water so supplied or to be supplied.

(3.) To alter and increase the present borrowing powers of the Corporation for the purpose of completing the works authorized by the Batley Corporation Waterworks Act, 1871, and to enable them to apply for that purpose the Corporate funds and any moneys which they are already authorized to borrow, and to borrow money by mortgage, debenture stock, or annuities, and to charge the moneys borrowed, or to be borrowed, by the Corporation or owing by them upon the borough fund, borough rate, lands, tenements, hereditaments, undertakings, and property, rates, rents, and revenue of the Corporation in any capacity, and to alter the present mode of charging moneys borrowed, and to alter the provisions now in force as to the repayment of moneys borrowed, and as to the sinking funds to be set apart for paying off moneys borrowed or owing.

(4.) To empower the Corporation to capitalize the interest heretofore paid by them on money borrowed and expended in the construction of their waterworks during the period of such construction and of the same being unproductive ; and also to capitalize the interest to be hereafter paid on moneys already borrowed and owing, and to be hereafter borrowed and expended in the construction of any works already authorized, or any alterations or repairs of the said works to be hereafter made, so long as the same may be unproductive.

(5.) To alter, amend, vary, or repeal the following sections of the Batley Corporation Waterworks Act, 1871, that is to say :—Sections 27 to 37, both inclusive, relating to compensation water ; Section 41, relating to penalties as to the discharge of compensation water ; Section 46, relating to power to supply water ; Section 73, relating to the application of receipts of the Corporation ; and

Section 74, relating to the application of money borrowed, and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof.

(6.) To alter, amend, vary, or repeal Section 77 of the Batley Corporation Waterworks Act, 1871, relating to the settlement of the amount, and payment and application of the purchase money for the share and interest of the Corporation in the Dewsbury, Batley, and Heckmondwike Waterworks, and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof.

(7.) To confirm the purchase by the Corporation of the Brownhill Mills and premises, situate in the townships of Holme and Cartworth, in the West Riding of the county of York, and to authorize the Corporation to sell and dispose of or lease the same, and to make provisions for the application of the purchase money and rents.

(8.) The intended Act will amend, so far as may be necessary for the purposes thereof, some of the provisions of the Waterworks Clauses Act, 1863 ; and it will alter, vary, extend, or repeal and consolidate all or some of the powers and provisions of the Batley Corporation Waterworks Act, 1871, and the Dewsbury and Heckmondwike Waterworks Act, 1876, and any other local and personal or public Acts relating to the public health or local government now in force within the district of the said borough ; and the intended Act will also alter, vary, and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with any of its objects, and confer other rights and privileges.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for an Act to effect the following purposes, or some of them (that is to say) :—

To alter, amend, or repeal an Act passed in the 10th year of the reign of His late Majesty King George IV., chapter 14, intituled "An Act for extinguishing Tithes and Payments in lieu of Tithes, Mortuaries, and Easter Offerings, and other Vicarial Dues and Payments, within the parish of Halifax, in the diocese and county of York ; and for making compensation to the Vicar in lieu thereof, and enabling him to grant certain Leases of Land belonging to the Vicarage" (which Act is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1829.")

Kent Waterworks.

(Extension of limits of supply of Company of Proprietors of the Kent Waterworks; Application within extended limits of powers of Company's existing Acts, and of Metropolis Water Acts, 1852 and 1871; New Works; Purchase of Lands; Agreements with Company of Proprietors of Lambeth Waterworks; Further money powers; Amendment of Acts.)

1. **N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill for effecting the purposes, or some of the purposes following, that is to say:—

2. To extend the limits within which the Company of Proprietors of the Kent Waterworks (in this notice called "the Company") are authorized to supply water, and to enable them to supply water for public and private purposes, to and within the parishes, townships, and places following, or some of them, or some part or parts thereof respectively, that is to say: Swanscombe, Stone, Darent, Wilmington, Sutton-at-Hone, Farningham, Eynsford, Footscray, North Cray, St. Paul's Cray, St. Mary Cray, Orpington, Farnborough, Chelsfield, Keston, West Wickham, and Hayes, in the county of Kent, and so much of the parish of Beckenham, in the same county, as adjoins on the east and north-east the parish of Bromley, and on the south the parish of Hayes, and is bounded on or towards the north by a road, in the parish of Beckenham, leading from Beckenham to Bromley, and called or known as the Bromley-road, and on the north-west, west, and south-west by two lanes, in the parish of Beckenham, respectively called or known as Scott's-lane and Hayes-lane.

3. To enable the Company to have and exercise, within such extended limits of supply, all or some of the powers and authorities conferred upon them in reference to or in connection with the supply of water or otherwise by the Kent Waterworks Act, 1809, the Kent Waterworks Acts Amendment Acts, 1811 and 1850, the Kent Waterworks Act, 1862, and the Kent Waterworks Act, 1864, and to have and exercise within every or any part of their district of supply for the time being all or some of the powers and authorities which, by the Metropolis Water Acts, 1852 and 1871, or either of them, the Company now have or may exercise within their existing district of supply, or any part thereof, and to demand, take, and levy rates, rents, and charges for and in respect of the supply of water within such extended limits, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment of such rates, rents, and charges respectively.

4. To authorize the Company to maintain or to make and maintain the waterworks and other works and conveniences following, or some of them, that is to say:

1. A well or wells and pumping station in the parish of Beckenham aforesaid (constructed by and in the occupation of the Company), situate in a field adjoining and on the south-west side of the London Chatham and Dover Railway, and about 350 yards south-east of the Shortlands Station on that railway.

2. A reservoir in the parish of Farnborough, in the county of Kent, on that part which is in the occupation of Charles Giles, of a piece of ground known as Cowlas, and numbered 110 on the Tithe Commutation Map of 1841, of the said parish of Farnborough, the said reservoir to be about 150 feet in length from north to south, and about 100 feet in width from east to west, and to be situate in the south-western portion of the said piece of ground.

3. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes (No. 1), commencing at the pumping station above described, and terminating in the intended reservoir above described, which said intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes will be made or pass from, in, through, or into the parishes of Beckenham, Bromley, and Farnborough, all in the county of Kent, or some of them.

4. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes (No. 2), commencing in the intended reservoir above described, and terminating at the existing pumping station of the Company at Crayford, near the Crayford Station on the South Eastern Railway, which intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes (No. 2) will be made or pass from, in, through, or into the parishes of Farnborough, Orpington, St. Mary Cray, St. Paul's Cray, Footscray, Chiselhurst, North Cray, Bexley, and Crayford, all in the county of Kent, or some of them.

5. To authorize the Company to deviate laterally from the lines of the intended works within the limits shown upon the plans hereinafter mentioned, or to such extent as may be prescribed by the Bill, and to deviate vertically from the levels of those works shown upon the sections hereinafter mentioned.

6. To authorize the Company to make and maintain in the parishes, townships, and places aforesaid, and every or any of them, in connection with the intended works hereinbefore described, all necessary and convenient approaches, embankments, roads, ways, wells, tunnels, adits, tanks,

filtering beds, dams, sluices, outfalls, channels, conduits, drains, pipes, engines, works, and conveniences for obtaining, collecting, filtering, storing, and distributing water.

7. To empower the Company to lay down, maintain, take up, alter, and repair mains, pipes, culverts, and other works for the distribution of water within their extended limits of supply to be defined by the Bill; and for that purpose and other purposes of the Bill from time to time to open or break up, alter, divert, or stop up, temporarily or permanently, any turnpike and other roads, streets, highways, footpaths, bridges, canals, towing-paths, streams, watercourses, sewers, drains, railways, and tramways within all or any of the parishes and places aforesaid, including Hayes-lane, Scott's-lane, and the Bromley-road above-mentioned, and any other road or highway adjoining their present or extended limits of supply.

8. To authorize the Company to purchase and take, by compulsion and otherwise, lands, houses, springs, streams, waters, and other hereditaments in the parishes, townships, and places aforesaid, or any estate, right, interest, or easement therein, for the purposes of the intended works and of the Bill; and the Bill will or may vary or extinguish any rights or privileges connected with any such lands, houses, springs, streams, waters, and hereditaments, and will or may incorporate with itself and apply to the works to be thereby authorized and to the Company in respect thereof, the provisions or some of the provisions of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the temporary occupation of lands near the railway during the construction thereof.

9. To empower the Company and the Company of Proprietors of Lambeth Waterworks (in this notice called "the Lambeth Company") from time to time to enter into and carry into effect, vary, and rescind contracts and agreements with reference to the supply of water and the construction of works within their respective districts, and to sanction and confirm any contract or agreement which may be made between the two Companies with reference to any of the matters aforesaid.

10. To enable the Company, for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, to apply their corporate funds and revenues, and for these purposes and for the general purposes of their undertaking, to raise further money by the creation of new shares or stock (ordinary or preferential, or both), and by borrowing on mortgage or otherwise.

11. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any way interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

12.
