

filtering beds, dams, sluices, outfalls, channels, conduits, drains, pipes, engines, works, and conveniences for obtaining, collecting, filtering, storing, and distributing water.

7. To empower the Company to lay down, maintain, take up, alter, and repair mains, pipes, culverts, and other works for the distribution of water within their extended limits of supply to be defined by the Bill; and for that purpose and other purposes of the Bill from time to time to open or break up, alter, divert, or stop up, temporarily or permanently, any turnpike and other roads, streets, highways, footpaths, bridges, canals, towing-paths, streams, watercourses, sewers, drains, railways, and tramways within all or any of the parishes and places aforesaid, including Hayes-lane, Scott's-lane, and the Bromley-road above-mentioned, and any other road or highway adjoining their present or extended limits of supply.

8. To authorize the Company to purchase and take, by compulsion and otherwise, lands, houses, springs, streams, waters, and other hereditaments in the parishes, townships, and places aforesaid, or any estate, right, interest, or easement therein, for the purposes of the intended works and of the Bill; and the Bill will or may vary or extinguish any rights or privileges connected with any such lands, houses, springs, streams, waters, and hereditaments, and will or may incorporate with itself and apply to the works to be thereby authorized and to the Company in respect thereof, the provisions or some of the provisions of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the temporary occupation of lands near the railway during the construction thereof.

9. To empower the Company and the Company of Proprietors of Lambeth Waterworks (in this notice called "the Lambeth Company") from time to time to enter into and carry into effect, vary, and rescind contracts and agreements with reference to the supply of water and the construction of works within their respective districts, and to sanction and confirm any contract or agreement which may be made between the two Companies with reference to any of the matters aforesaid.

10. To enable the Company, for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, to apply their corporate funds and revenues, and for these purposes and for the general purposes of their undertaking, to raise further money by the creation of new shares or stock (ordinary or preferential, or both), and by borrowing on mortgage or otherwise.

11. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any way interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

12. To amend or repeal, so far as may be necessary or expedient for any of the purposes of the Bill, the provisions or some of the provisions of the local and personal Acts following, or some or one of them, that is to say: 49 Geo. III, cap. 189; 51 Geo. III, cap. 145; 13 and 14 Vic., cap. 59; 23 and 24 Vic., cap. 78; 25 Vic., cap. 44; and 27 and 28 Vic., cap. 146, relating to the Company; and 11 and 12 Vic., cap. 7; 19 and 20 Vic., cap. 10; 32 and 33 Vic., cap. 4; and 34 and 35 Vic., cap. 83; relating to the Lambeth Company.

13. And notice is hereby also given, that on or before the 30th day of November, 1876, plans and sections of the works proposed to be authorized by the Bill, showing the situation and levels thereof, and of the lands and houses intended to be compulsorily taken under the powers of the Bill, with a book of reference to such plans, and a copy of this notice as published

in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Kent, at his office at Maidstone, in that county, and that on or before the said 30th day of November, a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and book of reference as relates to each parish in which any works are proposed to be constructed, or any land may be taken under the powers of the Bill, together with a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection with the parish clerk of each such parish, at his residence.

14. Printed copies of the intended Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, on or before the 21st day of December next.

Brotton and Lofthouse Gas Light and Coke Company, Limited.

(Application under "The Gas and Water Works Facilities Act, 1870," to the Board of Trade for a Provisional Order for powers to maintain, continue, and enlarge Gas Works, additional Land, Limits of District, power to manufacture Gas, break up Streets, additional Capital, levying of Rates, and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade on or before the 23rd day of December, 1876, by the Brotton and Lofthouse Gas Light and Coke Company, Limited (hereinafter called the Promoters), for a Provisional Order under "The Gas and Water Works Facilities Act, 1870," for all or some of the following purposes, that is to say:—To enable the Promoters (under their present name or under the style of the "Brotton Gas Light and Coke Company, Limited," if duly authorised to change such name) to maintain and continue, extend, and enlarge their existing Gas Works, situate in the Township and Parish of Brotton, in the North Riding of the County of York, on a certain Plot of Land belonging to the Promoters, bounded on the North by a street called Broadbent-street, on the East by land belonging to Christopher Jackson, Esq., on the West by the Cleveland Branch of the North-Eastern Railway, and on the South by land belonging to, or reputed to belong to, the Reverend James Barrow, and from time to time to purchase and hold, for the purposes of the said Order, any land not exceeding five acres in addition to the land last described.
