THE following Declaration has been signed to regulate, provisionally, Trade between Great Britain and Roumania :—

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Highness the Prince Charles of Roumania, being desirous of provisionally regulating the relations between the two countries during the period of time necessary for the negociation and conclusion of a Convention of Commerce, the Undersigned, duly authorized for this purpose, have agreed upon the following provisions :—

Produce of British origin, or coming from Great Britain, imported into Roumania, and produce of Roumanian origin, or coming from Roumania, imported in the United Kingdom, shall be respectively subject, with regard to import, export, or transit dues, with regard to re-exportation, brokerage, and warehousing, to local dues, and with regard to Customs formalities, to the same treatment as the produce of the most favoured nation.

The Government of His Highness the Prince Charles of Roumania, and the Government of His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, having agreed to secure to each other certain special advantages for the exchange and circulation of the produce of bordering districts, these advantages shall not be claimed by the United Kingdom.

If it be not expressly renewed the present provisional arrangement shall terminate on the 12th of May (30th of April), 1877.

In witness whereof the Undersigned have drawn up the present Declaration, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district

chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Luke situate within the limits of the parish of Dudley in the county of Worcester, and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Luke situate within the limits of the parish of Dudley as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Dudley which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Luke situate within the limits of such parish as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Luke Dudley.'

"And with the like consent of the said Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Luke situate within the limits of the parish of Dudley as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being Provided always that so long as the Reverend William Reyner Cosens, Doctor in Divinity, the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Dudley shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Luke situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said William Reyner Cosens; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Dudley being:—

"All that part of the parish of Dudley in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the west by the county boundary or in other words by the new parish of Pensnett in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield on the north by the new parish of Saint James Eve Hill, in the said county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the east and on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Eve Hill from the

And whereas the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation having been duly given to the persons or person having the care of the vaults or places of burial beneath the floor of the church of Saint Mary, Sculcoates, Hull, has made a representation, stating that, for the purpose of preventing the said vaults or places of burial from becoming or continuing dangerous or injurious to the public health, an Order should be made for the adoption of the measures which are hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the persons or person having the care of the said vaults or places of burial do adopt, or cause to be adopted, the following measures, viz. :—

BAPTIST BURIAL GROUND, LION STREET, ABERGAVENNY.—Forthwith wholly in the Baptist Burial-ground, Lion-street, Abergavenny, unless every coffin buried therein be embedded in concrete or otherwise entombed in an air-tight manner.
