Hull, March 14.

Efterday arrived here a Veffel of this place from Hambourgb, laden with Iron. There are lately put to Sea from this place two Ships for Amfierdam, one for Roan, and a Swede for Stockholme; all of them laden with the Commodities of these Parts.

, Several Veifels are daily feen paffing to and tro upon the Coafts, and on Wedneiday laft about forty fail of light thips paffed by for Newcafile. We hear not of late of any confiderable loffes upon the Coafts; only that the laft week a finall Veifel of this place laden with Coals, intended for London, was caft away near Bridlington.

Portsmouth, March 75.0 Yesterday in the morning, Sir Edward Sprage in the Revenge, with leveral other Fregats under his Command, went out to Spitthead. The last, night, a Merchant Ship, belonging to Amsterdam, laden homewards from the Madera's with Tobacco, Sugars, and Oade, having sprung a leak a was forced to put into this Harbour.

; Naples, Feb., 28. On Friday laft five Gallics belonging to the fquadron of this place went out to fea, whe con were embarked fix Companies of Spanish foot, to be transported to the Gyrifon of Portolongone, and other places belonging to His Catholique Majeliy, to fupply the room of thole Souldiars which are to be drawn away from those parts. Several of the Bandin that lately much diffurbed the Connercy by their f equent Robberies, are come in, and contenged to take employment in the war.

The Vice-Roy continues with extraor duary diligence to prepare for war, and has by his Letters to her Majefly the Queen Regent of Spain informed her, that by the end of April he fhalt have in readinels here above ten thousand able fouldiers, and 20 Gallies well equipped for fervice.

Ther 26th inftant in the Evening, the Prince di Caffiglione rearning late in his Coach from the Palaco, was pear the Porthalitha floor dead by four perfons on foot that there waited for him, whereof the Viec-Roy being informeria, immediately fent for a brother of the flain Prince, from the Caff o, where he was under confinement, with whom he had three hours private conference that n ghts and the gest morning publiked an EdiO, promiting four thouland. The Deputies from the Electors and Princes of the Fmpice, cominue fill here, expecting the return of the Mars quifs de Grave from Spain, with the refolution of that Court upon the Treaty between the Two Crowns 4 and Ais laid the Princes themselves intend in few days for this place, to confult with the Emperour about the Publick Affairs of the Empire.

Several perfons of our Turky Company lately arrived here, affure us of the good fuccels they have hitherto met with in that Trade, which they find much encouraged by the Grand Segnior; and that one Lelio, a Director of that Company, having been lately emploied in the Name of the reft, to Conflantinople, to negoriate in their behalf, had a favourable Audience in his Requests, and was difinish with much facisfaction; and had several rich Prefents made himp: which has to far encouraged, the Merchants here, that they refolved to dispatch away several Boars laden, with great quantities of rich Merchandise, which may go off immethately after Kafter.

Genoua, March 7. The 2d. inftant arrived here the Samfon and the Levant Merchant from Alecant and Long don, intending for Legarn, Naples, Meffina, and Scanderoon. Yefterday came in here the Madonna di Lorettu in 26 dayes from Lilbon. Off the Cape St. Vincent the mee with a Squadron of the Algier Corfaices with whom the exchanged fome Guns 1: but being a flour Ship and full manned, they had not the courage to board her; but gave her liberty to pur ue her Noyage. They inform us that the fix French Men of War which were lately out in fearch top prizes, were returned again to Thousan without any purchale.

On Sunday last arrived here from Tarin the Prince's of Monaco, with the Marquil's of Legorn, and the Marquel's his Lady, and the next day arrived allo by Sea the young Prince of Monaco, who have been all of them attended by the Nobility and Perlons of Quality, and, Lodged in the Palace of Segnior Micelo Deria.

From Milan we are adviled that the German forcom lately arrived in that Government, are ordered to quarter about Arong, for the lecurity of that Fort, and the parts adjoyning, and care is taken for the fortifying of all those places which lie most open to danger, feveral Waggons lay den with Arms and Ammunition being also font to be difp led of in the most convenient places. Count Belognini is lately arrived in Milan from Flanders with Commilfron for the (peedy railing of a shouland Italian foot, the forve as recruits for filling up fome of their old Regimentastring, Mar. 30, Two Eranch ships lately senutad

Kenice, Mar. 30., Two Brench thing lately returned from Constantinople, inform us, thes feveral Gallies and lately built and laoched there from the Arfend, and wa arming and fitting up with all expedition to joyn with levaral other. velicls, upon which are to be embarked fome thoulands of the Turks, to be fent for the relief of the Aremost to Canes. The Sultan continues his diversifemenes at Adrianople, but yet omits no opportunity of giving out Ordars for all necellary provisions for wars and drawing together great numbers of men from all parts-about block which as the with are to be commanded towards the borders: of Palanda to kneep that Kingdom in apprehension of an invalue, and if polluble to divare the Poleaders from uniting themfelyes with the Mulcovites.

A veilel arriving i om Zante, confirms to us the runnal i turry-disbanding of above 7000, Turks in Aderea, and the the forces that are got together about Salonies and Thebes openly protect that they will not be prevailed with to throw away their lives in Candia, being inficiently convinced of the differences of that employment by the lad face of the "Jete Army, which is almost rufined by the Sword, Plagues, and other accidents. Seve al vefiels that attended at Lepanto for the transporting those forces, are putting out to sea in search for Christian Prizes, under the command of a Son of Durachbech a noted Corfair.

They also inform us that General Andrea Valier had got together foreral hundred Labourers, which he is dispatching for Candia; where a'l hands are emploied in repairing their Fortifications, and drawing a New Line within the Old; and that our Admiral, with ten Light Gallies and two Galleafles well equipped and manned with Seamen and Souldiers, was gone out into the Archipelago, in fearch after tome Gallies and other Sups, laden with Me and Pro-'visions, ordered for the supply of the Grand Visier; whole 'Awmy is of late infinitely leffened by the Plague, near 4000 of them dying in a Moneth; which (upon the report of a Renegado) had reduced the Turks Army to the number only of fixteen or eighteen thousand men.

From Dalmatia we have advice that about the end of the laft moneth the Balla of Caffel Nuono being abroad with many perfons in his company, was fuddenly furprifed by a party of the Haydukes, and after a flort refiftance taken prifoher; that he had offered thirty thousand Realls to thole that fook him for his freedom : but they refufing his proffer had flert him to General Priuli, in whole power he now reimains.

۲ Danzitk, Mir. 14. Letters from Warfaw inform us that the a inftant, the States of Poland, by their Director-General, made leveral demands of the King, as particularly, that the Ministers of Foreign Princes, might be sud-denly disparcht and dismift the Court ; that the vacant Offices and Charges of the Kingdom might be conferred for the future only upon the Natives. That those Polanders that by the late Treaty with the Mulcovites, were dispossed of their Estates ; might have some farisfiction given them for their fufferings ; and that the privildeges of Pruffis might be confirmed : to the which His Majefty returned His Answer by his Vice-Chancellor to this Effect, that the greatest part of their demands being founded upon realon and juffice, he was willing whenforver they pleased to Grant and Sign them , but as to the point of difmiffing Foreign Ministers, he could not comply with them without a great difabligation to Foreign Princes, which answer has but little istisfied the States, who have fince this, upon farther confultation, published a Remonftrance to this Purport.

W Hereas all the Differences and Troubles which bave lately rifen in this Kingdom, have forung from no other Caufe, then the Election (which fome per-fons intended to have made) of a Successor to the Crown, during the life of our prefent King: For the timely prevention of so great an inconvenience, We by these prefents declare to the World our diffatisfaction in that point, and that in cafe of an Inter-regnum, should His Majesty (to whom we will a long and happy life) depart this world; We have Covenanted and Agreed amongft our felves to refume and observe atl and every point of the Order made concerning Élections ; as also the Diploma of Sigilmond the Third = and in no wife to allow of or confent to any such Election during His Majesties life, but to hold and effeem all and every perfox that shall be found to promote the fame, as Enemies to our Countrey. And if any Ministers of Forreign Potentates sha'l endeavour to advance their own interest, by encouraging any such Elesti-on > We ball declare and proceed against them (notwithfranding the Law of Mations) as Enemies of our And whenfocuer His Majefty fhall depart this CONNETCT. Life, We shall, according to our Obligation, immediate by upon the News thereof, proceed to the Election of a New King, without expetting an Universal Diet : Farthet dealaring shat who foever fait foreibly endeavour to obtaine she Crown , shall be proceeded against as a Common Eacmy.

Since this we have is confidently reported, that the D4as is broken up in much confusion and dilorder, but are again to affemble in May. That the Regiment of His Majofties Lifegard, confifting molt of Gentlen en, is difbanded, and that the F ench Ambaffadour has taken his leave and is gone.

Bruffells, March. 23. The Depu ies from the States of Holland having dispatched an Express to their Masters with an account of what had passed in their Negotiation here, and sent other dispatches to the Heer Van Beuning at Paris, went on Monday last for Maisnes to dispose of some affairs which they have with his E ectoral Highnels of Brandenbourg.

The Baron de Bergeick may on Monday next fet forwards for Aix la Chappelle, to affift as Plenipotentiary at the Treaty.

Hague, Mar. 23. The "tates have daily conference with Prince Maurice, and the Field Marefhal Wursz about the affairs of the Militia, and its faid intend to form two Armies, which fhall appear at a Rendezvouz between Bergen-op-zoom and Zniphen, one of them confifting of twenty Regiments of Foot, and eight of Horle, the other a leffer Army of twelve Regiments of Foot and four of Horle, to which may be joyned fome Companies of the Guards, and the Regiment of Horle belonging to the Heer de Leck. Care is a to taken for a train of Artillery proportionable for each body. The States have agreed with the Minifersof the Dukes of Lunenburg, for a confiderable part of their Forces, whereof 3000 Foot, and rooo Horle are ready for Employment.

The Report of the motion of the Bishop of Munfiers Forces is not at all confirmed, and therefore thought to have little truth in it

Park, Mart. 24 A Courier lately attived there from the Marquifs de Caftel Rodrigo, brings with him his Relolution touching the Alternative propoled to him by His Majelty, he being willing to yield to His Majelty all the Conquetts of the laft Campagne, without any Equivalent 3 demanding the Reflictution of Francke Comte, and what other places have been of late taken in the Low Courseries z of which the Queen of Spains Confirmation will be expected

The Envoyes from the Princes of the Empire, intend fuddenly to attend His Majefly at St. Germaines upon the butinels of the Treaty, and to defire a lon er fulpenfon of Arms: It is also faid that His Maj fly has already lent His Orders into the Netherlands, for the refloring of Guenap to the Spaniards, as being taken within the time allowed by him for Ceffation of Arms.

The late arrived Envoyé from Portugal has complet mented His Majefty on the behalf of the Prince Regent 3 affuring him of his defire to maintain a ft ift friendfhip and a right underflanding between them ; withal acquainting His M jefty with the purport of his late received Letters from Lisbon, that the Prince Regent having taken notice of fome arts which had been uled to draw off the French Troops inco the Spanish Service / had commanded all his Subjects upon pain of death to hinder their paffage ; in cale they fhould have any fuch intention ; refolving to return thole Forces entire to His Majefty, in acknowledgment of the Services he had received by them : And that Monfeent & schombirg lies ready to embarque with them upon the first arrival of the French Ships expected for their Tranflortation.

Tarmouth, Mar. 16. Yesterday failed by us several laden Colliers to the southwards. This day we are informed that a ship of this Town that was thought to have been call sway by storm above 14 weeks since, was driven upon the lifes of Orkney, where this was forced to continue for some time, and is since returned thence to Scarborough!

Pipmouth, Mar. 16. Sie Thomas Allen with his Iquid dron ftillcontinues, éthizing about the Litards where the 10 inflatt he met with about 12 fail of Ho land Merchanemen, with 4 men of war commanded by the Hear Cornes sius Evereson of Ulushing y between whom passed the usual ceremonies practified at Seng they giving the sound for due to His Majeries Flags pretending to be bound for Cadiq.
