

In the London Bankruptcy Court.

In the Matter of John Davenport, of 14, Little Tower-street, in the city of London, and of 18, the Gardens, Peckham Rye, in the county of Surrey, trading under the style or firm of Davenport Brothers, Tea Merchant, a Bankrupt.
