WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Bole, in the county of Nottingham, and in the diocese of Lincoln, one capital sum of fifty pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of erecting certain outbuildings in connection with the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Bole.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of a piece or parcel of land, comprising one thousand and seventy-seven square yards or thereabouts, which has been permanently secured to the rectory of Saint Mary, Wombwell, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said rectory of Saint Mary, Wombwell, to meet such benefaction, one capital sum of two hundred and two pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said rectory, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said rectory of Saint Mary, Wombwell.
