THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

NEWMARKET FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 6th day of February, 1877; a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices acting in the Newmarket Petty Sessional Division of the county of Suffolk, that a Fair has been annually held on the 8th day of November, and continued from that day to the second following Tuesday, in the parish of Newmarket St. Mary, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished:

2. On the 6th day of April, 1877, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair.
